20	disabilities; establishing criteria; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and

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24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 336, O.S.L.
 2013, as amended by Section 1, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S.
 Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.7), is amended to read as follows:
 Section 6-122.7. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of the
 law, the State Board of Education shall issue a one-year provisional

6 certificate to teach in the area of mild-moderate or disabilities, 7 severe-profound disabilities or comprehensive special education to 8 any qualified candidate who has:

9 1. Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited10 institution of higher education;

Been recommended for a certificate by a school district
 board of education or an accredited institution of higher education;

Satisfactorily completed a one-hundred-fifty-clock-hour
 special education program prescribed by the Board; and

4. On file with the Board a national criminal history record
check as required pursuant to Section 5-142 of this title. The
individual applying for a provisional certificate shall be
responsible for the cost of the national criminal history record
check.

B. The one-year provisional certificate issued pursuant to this section may be renewed for two (2) additional periods of one-year each upon proof from an accredited institution of higher education that the individual has successfully completed at least six (6) credit hours of prescribed coursework during the previous year in a

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1 nontraditional route to certification program in either mild-2 moderate or severe-profound disabilities or toward a master's degree 3 in special education.

C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board
of Education shall issue a standard certificate in the area of mildmoderate or <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or</u>
comprehensive special education to any individual who has:

8 1. Been issued one or more provisional certificates pursuant to9 this section;

2. Successfully completed the prescribed coursework of a 10 11 nontraditional route to certification program in either mild-12 moderate or severe-profound disabilities or a master's degree in special education from an accredited institution of higher education 13 within three (3) years of issuance of the original provisional 14 15 certificate and any examinations required to obtain a standard certificate in mild-moderate or disabilities, severe-profound 16 disabilities or comprehensive special education; 17

Successfully completed the appropriate subject area
 competency examination as required pursuant to Section 6-187 of this
 title; and

4. Submitted an application and payment of the requiredcertification fee.

D. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an individualwho holds a current provisional certificate pursuant to subsection A

or B of this section or a current standard certificate pursuant to subsection C of this section may satisfy the highly qualified teacher requirement for early childhood education or elementary education by successful completion of the early childhood education or elementary education examinations.

E. To obtain standard certification in early childhood
education or elementary education, an individual shall complete an
appropriate teacher education program approved by the Oklahoma
Commission for Teacher Preparation.

F. Nothing in this section shall change the requirements an individual is required to satisfy to be considered highly qualified in a secondary core academic area.

G. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to implementthe provisions of this section.

Section 2, Chapter 336, O.S.L. 15 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 2013, as amended by Section 2, Chapter 120, O.S.L. 2014 (70 O.S. 16 Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.8), is amended to read as follows: 17 Section 6-122.8. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of 18 law, the State Board of Education shall issue a standard certificate 19 in the area of mild-moderate or disabilities, severe-profound 20 disabilities or comprehensive special education to any individual 21 who has: 22

Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited
 institution of higher education;

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2. Successfully completed the prescribed coursework that may be
 required for a master's degree in special education from an
 accredited institution of higher education and any examinations
 required to obtain a standard certificate in mild-moderate or
 <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or comprehensive special</u>
 education;

3. Successfully completed the appropriate subject area
competency examination as required pursuant to Section 6-187 of this
title;

4. On file with the State Board of Education a national
 criminal history record check as required pursuant to Section 5-142
 of this title; and

13 5. Submitted an application and payment of the required14 certification fee.

B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, an individual who holds a current standard certificate pursuant to subsection A of this section can satisfy the highly qualified teacher requirement for early childhood education or elementary education by successful completion of the early childhood education or elementary education examinations.

C. To obtain standard certification in early childhood
education or elementary education, the individual shall complete an
appropriate teacher education program approved by the Oklahoma
Commission for Teacher Preparation.

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1 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 120, O.S.L.
2 2014 (70 O.S. Supp. 2019, Section 6-122.9), is amended to read as
3 follows:

Section 6-122.9. A. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the State Board of Education shall issue a standard certificate in the area of mild-moderate or <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or comprehensive special education</u> to any individual certified via an alternative certification route in early childhood education or elementary education who has:

Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited
 institution of higher education;

Successfully completed the mild-moderate or disabilities,
 severe-profound disabilities or comprehensive special education
 competency examinations; and

Submitted an application and payment of the required
 certification fee.

B. Notwithstanding any other provision of law and with the exception of paraprofessionals under the Career Development areas, the State Board of Education shall issue a standard certificate in the area of mild-moderate or <u>disabilities</u>, severe-profound disabilities <u>or comprehensive special education</u> to any individual certified via an alternative certification route in a core academic area, which includes Mathematics, Science, English, Language Arts,

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History, Foreign Language, Music, Art, Elementary Education and
 Early Childhood Education, who has:

3 1. Earned a bachelor's level college degree from an accredited 4 institution of higher education;

5 2. Successfully completed the mild-moderate or disabilities,
6 severe-profound disabilities or comprehensive special education
7 competency examinations; and

8 3. Submitted an application and payment of the required9 certification fee.

10 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6-122.10 of Title 70, unless 12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The State Board of Education shall issue a two-year provisional certificate in the area of severe-profound disabilities to any individual who has:

16 1. Obtained a standard certificate in the area of mild-moderate 17 disabilities;

Been recommended for a certificate in the area of severe profound disabilities by a school district board of education; and

Submitted an application and payment of the required
 certification fee.

B. An individual who completes the requirements of subsection A
of this section may be eligible to receive a standard certificate in
the area of severe-profound disabilities upon completion of:

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1	1. A micro-credentialing program in the area of severe-profound
2	disabilities approved by the State Board of Education. The micro-
3	credentialing program shall include competencies described in
4	Section 6-187 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or
5	2. The subject area competency examination required by Section
6	6-187 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
7	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2020.
8	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
9	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
10	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
11	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
