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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
20	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 10 O.S. 2011, Section 601.31, is		
21	amended to read as follows:		
22	Section 601.31 A. The Oklahoma Commission on Children and		
23	Youth shall:		
24	1. Promulgate rules providing for:		

1	a.	the training and continuing training requirements for

18	B. The Board of Child Abuse Examination shall:
19	1. Prepare the rules, standards and forms required by

21	and forms as necessary, for the approval of the Commission;
22	2. In cooperation with the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma
23	State University, develop and maintain training programs and
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consultation services for physicians and Child Abuse Examiners,
 child abuse examiners and child abuse medical examiners;

3 3. In consultation and cooperation with the Department of Human
4 Services and the Oklahoma Health Care Authority, develop a uniform
5 system of reimbursement for medical examinations and evaluations of
6 cases of suspected child abuse or neglect which are compensable
7 pursuant to Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act for
8 adoption by the Oklahoma Health Care Authority;

9 4. Develop and maintain an accurate listing of trained Child
10 Abuse Examiners child abuse examiners and child abuse medical
11 <u>examiners</u> for distribution by the Commission; and

12 5. Engage in such other activities as necessary and appropriate 13 for the establishment and maintenance of a statewide system of 14 expert medical examination and evaluation of children suspected to 15 be victims of child abuse and neglect, subject to the approval and 16 authorization of the Commission.

17 C. The Chief Child Abuse Examiner shall be a physician with 18 experience in the area of child abuse and neglect and, as requested 19 or directed by the Board, shall:

20 1. Provide consultant services to the Board as necessary for 21 the preparation of the rules, standards and forms required by 22 subsection A of this section;

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Assist the Board and the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma
 State University with the development, implementation, maintenance
 and coordination of the training programs required by this section;

3. Prepare written reports for the Board and the Commission
5 regarding progress of the system established by this act; and

4. As requested by the Board, perform other duties as necessary
to assist the Board in the performance of its duties and
responsibilities.

9 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1150.6 of Title 10, unless there 11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 Beginning November 1, 2019, and subject to the availability Α. 13 of funds, the Director of the Bureau of Vital Statistics shall, 14 within seventy-two (72) hours of receipt of notice of any child 15 death, forward the name, date of birth, date of death and other 16 identifying information about the child who has died to the Oklahoma 17 Commission on Children and Youth. The Commission shall submit the 18 information for a child maltreatment medical review to a child abuse 19 medical examiner in the county where the suspected maltreatment 20 occurred or a child abuse pediatrician in the state.

B. The findings of the child maltreatment medical review shall be reported to the Department of Human Services, the law enforcement agency and the child advocacy center or child abuse

24 multidisciplinary team where the suspected maltreatment occurred and

1 the Child Death Review Board. The findings of the child 2 maltreatment medical review shall be considered prior to closing an 3 investigation or assessment conducted by the Department of Human 4 Services related to the child death.

5 C. Subject to the availability of funds, the Commission may 6 provide stipends to child abuse medical examiners who perform child 7 maltreatment medical reviews and report their findings pursuant to 8 this section.

9 D. As used in this section, "child maltreatment medical review" 10 means a review of information by a child abuse medical examiner 11 about suspected child maltreatment with the intent to determine if 12 maltreatment occurred. The review of information may include, but 13 is not limited to, information obtained from law enforcement 14 agencies, the Department of Human Services, medical records, 15 forensic interviews and other relevant information.

SECTION 3. This act shall become effective July 1, 2019. SECTION 4. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
