**Research Analysis**

HB 1201 removes the use of the omnibus resolution to approve rules. The measure returns to the administrative rule approval process used prior to the adoption of HB 2055 in 2013. The measure provides for the disapproval of any proposed rule by the adoption of a Joint resolution. The measure requires any new proposed rule to include reference to state or federal authority for the rule. Any rules not disapproved by Joint resolution shall be deemed approved.

The measure repeals Title 75, Section 308.3 relating to the Omnibus Resolution.
