**Research Analysis**

HB 1933 removes the restriction on the number of special investigators that can be employed by the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation. The measure allows the OSBI to employ a Human Resources Director and a Comptroller.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 1933 in its current form modifies the list of positions at the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation that are unclassified for purposes of the merit system. Such action allows the agency greater flexibility regarding the salary paid to such unclassified positions. Whether the change provided by HB 1933 results in increased or decreased compensation costs for the agency will be determined by the employee compensation choices made by the agency. The measure does not mandate any increase or decrease in employee compensation; therefore, HB 1933 in its current form has no direct impact on the state budget or revenues.
