**Research Analysis**

HB 2019 requires the court to inquire about the pregnancy or primary caregiver status of the accused person when making a pretrial release determination and upon sentencing. If the court determines that the accused person is pregnant or is the primary caregiver and the person does not impose a substantial risk of physical harm to the community, the court shall permit pretrial release on his or her own personal recognizance. At sentencing, the court may impose an individually assess sentence, without imprisonment.
