Bill Analysis

SB 1462 creates a felony for individuals attempting to gain financial advantage or gain anything of value as a result of the nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images. The newly created felony shall be punishable by up to 4 years imprisonment and up to 10 years imprisonment for second and subsequent convictions. A second conviction will require the offender to register as a sex offender. The state shall not have the discretion to file a misdemeanor charge on any individual who commits the newly created felony. The provisions of the Sex Offenders Registration Act shall apply to any individual who receives a second or subsequent conviction, but shall not apply to the individual while incarcerated in a medium or maximum security prison.

Fiscal Analysis

FY'21 Impact: Contingent upon convictions and sentencing

Full Year Impact: Contingent upon convictions and sentencing

Introduced– Creates a felony for individuals who gain or attempt to gain financially or otherwise as a result of the nonconsensual dissemination of private sexual images. A first violation is punishable by imprisonment up to 4 years, a second violation by imprisonment up to 10 years and requires the offender to register as a sex offender. Does not allow the state discretion to file a misdemeanor charge for the violation. The provisions of the Sex Offender Registration Act also applies to any person who has received a deferred judgment in any court outside the state for a crime, if committed in Oklahoma would be a violation of the provisions of this bill. It does not apply to a person while incarcerated in a maximum or medium DOC facility.
