**Bill Analysis**

SB 1629 modifies the term “small farm winery” to clarify that such a farm must use grapes, berries, other fruits, honey or vegetables grown in this state to produce no less than 5% of the wine manufactured annually by the small farm winery. The measure also defines “small farm producer” to mean a person that annually produces in this state no less than 100 pounds of sound ripe grapes, 1000 pounds of other sound ripe fruit or berries, or 100 pounds of honey.

SB 1629 modifies the definition of a small farm winery to require at least 5% of the wine to be made with Oklahoma grown products, but does not modify the quantity limits of wine produced to qualify as a small farm winery. There is no fiscal impact to the state.
