Bill Analysis

SB 92 requires school districts to be annually reviewed to determine if they meet standards for federal funding, health and safety, and certification for teachers and administrators. Schools will also receive a quadrennial evaluation to determine if they meet accreditation standards. If a school receives a deficiency score on its accreditation report, the school will be subject to an annual review of their accreditation standards.

Fiscal Analysis

No impact.

With certain exceptions, and beginning with the 2019-20 school year, evaluations of schools to determine whether they meet accreditation standards shall occur once every 4 years. However, they shall be evaluated annually for other standards.

Beginning with the 2019-20 school year, if a school receives a deficiency on its accreditation report, the school shall be evaluated annually. If the school receives no deficiencies for 2 consecutive years, their evaluations will revert to every 4 years.
