**Fiscal Analysis**

HB1269 applies the provisions of SQ780 retroactively and will have both positive and negative impacts to state agencies.

- DOC: estimated cost aversion of \$900,000-\$1.3 million for possession charges alone depending on the effective date of the measure.
- Dist. Courts: required to re-sentence within 3 months- could increase dockets for the short term, possible increase in overtime and/or compensatory time
- DA's: possible short-term increase in workload for determining property crime eligibility and re-sentencing procedure
- OIDS: required representation for any indigent inmates requested to re-sentencing. These defense attorneys are currently paid an average of \$490.35/case
