6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to public health and safety; amending  
8 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1451, which relates to the  
9 Oklahoma Medical Micropigmentation Regulation Act;  
10 modifying definition; and providing an effective  
11 date.

12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2011, Section 1-1451, is  
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1-1451. As used in the Oklahoma Medical  
16 Micropigmentation Regulation Act:

17 1. "Licensing board" means the Oklahoma State Board of Medical  
18 Licensure and Supervision, the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners  
19 and/or the Board of Dentistry;

20 2. "Medical micropigmentation" means a medical procedure in  
21 which any color or pigment is applied with a needle, microblade or  
22 electronic machine:

23 a. to produce a ~~permanent~~ indelible mark visible  
24 through the skin,

- 1           b.    above the jawline and anterior to the ear and frontal  
2                    hairline including but not limited to application of  
3                    eyeliner, eye shadow, lips, eyebrows, cheeks, and  
4                    scars, and/or  
5           c.    for repigmentation of areas involving reconstructive  
6                    surgery or trauma.

7 Medical micropigmentation shall not include placing on the body any  
8 pictures, images, numbers, signs, letters of the alphabet, or  
9 designs. Medical micropigmentation shall not be construed to be  
10 included in the definition of tattooing as provided in Section ~~841~~  
11 842.1 of Title 21 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

12       3.    "Physician" means a person licensed to practice:

- 13           a.    allopathic medicine and surgery by the Oklahoma State  
14                    Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision pursuant to  
15                    the Oklahoma Allopathic Medical and Surgical Licensure  
16                    and Supervision Act,  
17           b.    osteopathic medicine by the State Board of Osteopathic  
18                    Examiners pursuant to the Oklahoma Osteopathic  
19                    Medicine Act, or  
20           c.    dentistry by the Board of Dentistry pursuant to the  
21                    State Dental Act.

22       SECTION 2.   This act shall become effective November 1, 2019.
