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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
14	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 252, O.S.L.		
15	2018 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 2-1002), is amended to read as		
16	follows:		
17	Section 2-1002. A. The Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board		
18	shall be composed of twenty (20) <u>twenty-two (22)</u> members, or their		
19	designees, as follows:		
20	1. Ten <u>Twelve</u> of the members shall be:		
21	a. the Attorney General or designee,		
22	b. the Chief Medical Examiner or designee,		
23	c. the State Commissioner of Health or designee,		
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1	d.	the Chief of Injury Prevention Services of the State
2		Department of Health or designee,
3	е.	the President of the Oklahoma State Medical
4		Association or designee,
5	f.	the Director of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and
6		Dangerous Drugs Control or designee,
7	g.	the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health
8		and Substance Abuse Services or designee,
9	h.	the President of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association
10		or designee,
11	i.	the Director of the Department of Human Services or
12		designee, and
13	j.	the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of
14		Investigation or designee ; and ,
15	<u>k.</u>	the President of the Association of Oklahoma Narcotic
16		Enforcers or designee, and
17	<u>l.</u>	the Executive Director of the State Board of Pharmacy
18		or designee; and
19	2. Ten o	f the members shall be appointed by the Attorney
20	General, shal	l serve for terms of two (2) years and shall be
21	eligible for	reappointment. The members shall be persons having
22	training and	experience in matters related to opioid abuse and
23	prevention.	The appointed members shall include:

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- a. a county sheriff selected from a list of three names
 submitted by the executive board of the Oklahoma
 Sheriffs' Association,
- b. a chief of a municipal police department selected from
 a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma
 Association of Chiefs of Police,
- c. an attorney licensed in this state who is in private
 practice selected from a list of three names submitted
 by the Board of Governors of the Oklahoma Bar
 Association,
- 11 d. a district attorney selected from a list of three
 12 names submitted by the District Attorneys Council,
- e. a physician with emergency medical training selected
 from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma
 State Medical Association,
- 16 f. a physician with experience in drug addiction
 17 treatment and recovery selected from a list of three
 18 names submitted by the Oklahoma Osteopathic
 19 Association,
- 20 g. a nurse selected from a list of three names submitted
 21 by the Oklahoma Nurses Association,
- h. two individuals, at least one of whom shall be a
 person who currently receives or formerly has been a
 consumer of addiction recovery services related to

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opioid use, selected from a list of three names
 submitted by the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health
 and Substance Abuse Services, and

i. a member of the judiciary selected from a list of 4 5 three names submitted by the Oklahoma Supreme Court. Every two (2) years the Board shall elect from among its 6 Β. membership a chair and a vice-chair. The Board shall meet at least 7 quarterly and may meet more frequently as necessary as determined by 8 9 the chair. Members shall serve without compensation but may be 10 reimbursed for necessary travel out of funds available to the Office 11 of the Attorney General and the Department of Mental Health and 12 Substance Abuse Services τ pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement 13 Act; provided, that the reimbursement shall be paid in the case of state employee members by the agency employing the member. 14

15 C. With funds appropriated or otherwise available for that 16 purpose, the Office of the Attorney General, jointly with the 17 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, shall 18 provide administrative assistance and services to the Opioid 19 Overdose Fatality Review Board.

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 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.

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
