12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:				
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified				
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-223 of Title 11, unless there				
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:				
16	A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Electrical Access and				
17	Resiliency (OEAR) Task Force.				
18	B. The task force shall consist of thirteen (13) members as				
19	follows:				
20	1. The Secretary of Energy, or designee, who shall serve as the				
21	task force chair;				
22	2. Three members appointed by the Governor:				
23	a. a representative of an organization representing				
24	municipalities,				

1		b.	a representative of a non-profit public power utility
2			located in this state, and
3		с.	a representative of a manager of an electrical grid or
4			power pool;
5	3. 2	A COI	rporation commissioner, or designee;
6	4. 1	Four	members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the

8		a.	a representative of an organization representing
9			electrical cooperatives,
10		b.	a professional with academic expertise or a minimum of
11			a master's degree in electrical engineering, grid
12			management or a related field, and
13		с.	two members of the Oklahoma Senate who are from
14			different political parties and shall serve as ex
15			officio members; and
16	5. 1	Four	members appointed by the Speaker of the House of

18		a.	a representative of a publicly traded electric utility

C. The task force shall study nationally recognized best
 practices to provide additional revenues and local control for
 communities by having a choice in electric energy suppliers and make
 recommendations regarding:

The removal of the moratorium on the use of municipal
 condemnation to acquire electric facilities of an incumbent
 investor-owned utility as defined in Section 21-222 of Title 11 of
 the Oklahoma Statutes;

9 2. The authority to give municipal utilities the ability to use
10 the power of eminent domain to allow for community choice of
11 electric energy suppliers;

3. The imposition of new growth taxation of two percent (2%) tax on gross sales beginning tax year 2022 on any provider of wholesale sale of electric power to municipal corporations if the providers were not in operation prior to the effective date of this act;

Strategies to enable community choice of electric energy
 suppliers, whether legislatively or otherwise; and

19 5. Whether a need exists to provide for ongoing evaluation of 20 the implementation of these rights and, if such a need does exist, 21 the task force shall:

a. identify the scope and nature of the need, and
b. make recommendations on how best to fill that need,
whether legislatively or otherwise.

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1	D. The task force shall submit a final report of its findings
2	and any recommendations to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore
3	of the Senate and the Speaker of the Oklahoma House of
4	Representatives not later than a year after the effective date of
5	this act.
6	E. The provisions of this section shall cease to have the force
7	and effect of law and the task force shall terminate following the
8	submission of the final report.
9	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2021.
10	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
11	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
12	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
13	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
