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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1835, is
14	amended to read as follows:
15	Section 1835. A. Whoever shall willfully or maliciously enter
16	the garden, yard, pasture or field of another after being expressly
17	forbidden to do so or without permission by the owner or lawful
18	occupant thereof when such property is posted, as defined by this
19	subsection, shall be deemed guilty of trespass and upon conviction
20	thereof shall be fined in any sum punished by a fine of not to
21	exceed more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00); provided, that
22	this provision shall not apply to registered land surveyors and
23	registered professional engineers for the purpose of land surveying
24	in the performance of their professional services; and, provided

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1 further, that anyone who willfully or maliciously enters any such 2 garden, yard, pasture or field, and therein commits or attempts to commit waste, theft, or damage shall be deemed guilty of a 3 4 misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum 5 punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by confinement imprisonment 6 7 in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. For purposes 8 9 of this section, "posted" means exhibiting:

10 <u>1. Exhibiting</u> signs to read as follows: "PROPERTY RESTRICTED"; 11 "POSTED - KEEP OUT"; "KEEP OUT"; "NO TRESPASSING"; or similar signs 12 which are displayed. Property that is fenced or not fenced must <u>All</u> 13 <u>property shall</u> have such signs placed conspicuously and at all 14 places where entry to the property is normally expected; or

15 <u>2. Placing purple paint marks on posts on the property,</u> 16 provided that the marks are:

- 17 <u>a. vertical lines at least one (1) inch in width and at</u>
 18 <u>least eight (8) inches in length,</u>
 19 b. placed so that the bottom of the mark is not less that
- 19b.placed so that the bottom of the mark is not less than20three (3) feet from the ground or more than five (5)21feet from the ground, and
 - c. placed at locations that are readily visible to any person approaching the property and no more than one
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1 thousand (1,000) feet apart on land other than forest, 2 and one hundred (100) feet apart on forest land. Beginning November 1, 2021, when a landowner uses the purple 3 в. 4 posting to indicate no trespassing, such marks shall be accompanied 5 by signs placed conspicuously and at all places where entry to the property is normally expected explaining that the purple stripe 6 7 means no trespassing, property restricted, or similar explanation of what the purple stripe indicates. On and after November 1, 2022, no 8 9 sign shall be required to explain the purple posting.

10 <u>C.</u> No provisions of this act <u>section</u> shall <u>be construed to</u> 11 conflict with Section 5-202 or 6-304 of Title 29 of the Oklahoma 12 Statutes.

13 C. D. Whoever shall willfully enter the pecan grove of another 14 without the prior consent of the owner or occupant thereof to so do 15 shall be deemed guilty of trespass and upon conviction thereof shall 16 be fined in any sum punished by a fine of not to exceed more than 17 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00); provided, that anyone who willfully 18 enters any such pecan grove and therein commits or attempts to 19 commit waste, theft, or damage shall be deemed guilty of a 20 misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum 21 punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), 22 or by confinement imprisonment in the county jail for not less than 23 thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine 24 and imprisonment.

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1 D. E. Whoever shall willfully or maliciously enter upon 2 property owned or managed by the Grand River Dam Authority without permission when such property is posted shall be deemed guilty of 3 4 misdemeanor trespass and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in 5 any sum punished by a fine of not to exceed more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00); provided, that this provision shall not 6 7 apply to registered land surveyors and registered professional engineers for the purpose of land surveying in the performance of 8 9 their professional services; and, provided further, that anyone who 10 willfully or maliciously enters upon property owned or managed by 11 the Grand River Dam Authority without permission and therein commits 12 or attempts to commit waste, theft, or damage shall be deemed guilty 13 of misdemeanor trespass, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined 14 in any sum punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars 15 (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by 16 confinement imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty 17 (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and 18 imprisonment. For purposes of this section subsection, "posted" 19 means exhibiting signs to read as follows: "PROPERTY RESTRICTED"; "POSTED - KEEP OUT"; "KEEP OUT"; "NO TRESPASSING"; or similar signs 20 21 which are displayed. Property that is fenced or not fenced must 22 have such signs placed conspicuously and at all places where entry 23 to the property is normally expected shall be defined as provided 24 for in subsection A of this section.

1	E. F. Notwithstanding the provisions of this section, the
2	Governor's Mansion and its grounds and appurtenances shall not be
3	required to be posted with signs warning against trespass. Any
4	person who shall willfully or maliciously enter the grounds of the
5	Governor's Mansion within the State Capitol Park, as defined in
6	Section 1811.4 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, except at a
7	place where entry to the property is normally expected shall be
8	deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined in
9	a sum punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars
10	(\$500.00), or by confinement <u>imprisonment</u> in the county jail for not
11	less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both
12	such fine and imprisonment.
13	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
