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7 An Act relating to psychiatric and chemical  
8 dependency service; amending 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-  
9 880.6, which relates to psychiatric and chemical  
10 dependency service requirements; creating exception;  
11 and providing an effective date.

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12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 1-880.6, is  
14 amended to read as follows:

15 Section 1-880.6 A. Every entity desiring to establish a new  
16 psychiatric or chemical dependency service or to acquire, lease or  
17 expand an existing service whether through construction or  
18 conversion of facilities, shall make application to the State  
19 Department of Health for a certificate of need in such form and  
20 accompanied by such information, including a complete list of  
21 stockholders, partners, and owners, and any other information, as  
22 the Board shall prescribe.

23 B. The provisions of the Psychiatric and Chemical Dependency  
24 Facility Certificate of Need Act shall not apply to any hospital as

1 defined by Section 1-710 of this title licensed by the State  
2 Department of Health on or before December 31, 1990, which has:

3 1. Construction cost overruns or capital expenditures for  
4 completion of originally approved beds or completion of previously  
5 constructed and shelled space arising out of and based only upon the  
6 original certificate of need issued by the Commissioner for said  
7 construction, when such construction costs or capital expenditures  
8 do not or will not increase the approved number of beds, allow  
9 conversion of bed use shall not be deemed new construction or  
10 increase pricing structure for treatment or services; or

11 2. Negotiated a contract with an agency of this state, the  
12 federal government or a Native American nation duly recognized by  
13 the federal government that specifies the number of beds and their  
14 uses. A hospital provided for by ~~paragraph 2~~ of this subsection  
15 shall be exempt from the certificate of need required by the  
16 Psychiatric and Chemical Dependency Facility Certificate of Need Act  
17 for the purposes specified in the contract. This exemption shall  
18 not apply to Medicare or Medicaid contracts or contracts for  
19 inpatient services for children or adolescents.

20 C. The provisions of the Psychiatric and Chemical Dependency  
21 Facility Certificate of Need Act shall not apply to a facility  
22 constructed or operated by the University Hospitals Authority or  
23 University Hospitals Trust, or by a nonprofit entity which has  
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1 entered into a joint operating agreement with the University  
2 Hospitals Trust or a subsidiary of such an entity.

3 D. The Commissioner of Health is authorized to grant a  
4 certificate of need if the entity applying for the certificate has  
5 filed a notice on a form prescribed by the State Department of  
6 Health which shall include, but not be limited to:

7 1. The name and location of the entity;

8 2. The name and address of each person having an ownership  
9 interest in the entity;

10 3. The nature of the acquisition, expansion, addition or  
11 conversion, whether by sale, lease or other arrangement;

12 4. The parties to the sale, lease or other arrangement;

13 5. The size of the acquisition, expansion, addition or  
14 conversion;

15 6. The approximate cost of the acquisition, expansion, addition  
16 or conversion; and

17 7. The projected date of completion.

18 ~~D.~~ E. The Commissioner of Health shall be notified, on a form  
19 prescribed by the State Department of Health, of the following:

20 1. Any decrease in the number of beds of a hospital, facility  
21 or hospital unit; and

22 2. Any change in the designation for a continuum of care in  
23 psychiatric or chemical dependency treatment.

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1        ~~E.~~ F. Psychiatric and chemical dependency service for which a  
2 certificate of need is required shall include:

3            1. Any capital investment or lease of Five Hundred Thousand  
4 Dollars (\$500,000.00) or more, including predevelopment activities  
5 such as arrangements and commitments for financing, architectural  
6 designs, plans, working drawings, specifications and site  
7 acquisition; provided, that this dollar limit shall not apply to a  
8 change in bed capacity;

9            2. Acquisition of a facility by purchase, lease, donation or  
10 through transfer of stock or corporate merger. If the Department  
11 finds that a proposed acquisition is consistent with the criteria  
12 and standards for review of such projects, then the Department shall  
13 issue a certificate of need. If the Department finds that the  
14 proposed acquisition is not consistent with the criteria, the  
15 project will be referred to the Commissioner of Health for final  
16 determination. The Department's determination to approve the  
17 proposed acquisition or to refer it to the Commissioner shall be  
18 made no later than fifteen (15) days following the day the  
19 application is determined to be complete and review ready, or the  
20 proposed acquisition shall be automatically approved. Proposed  
21 acquisitions shall be reviewed against standards adopted by the  
22 Department which relate only to the acquirer's capability to operate  
23 a facility; or

1 3. Inpatient psychiatric and chemical dependency services for  
2 persons under eighteen (18) years of age offered or provided by a  
3 hospital or other health care facility, including but not limited to  
4 any conversion of existing beds, any increase in bed capacity and  
5 any new beds for the purpose of offering or providing said services,  
6 regardless of any capital or other costs of the project.

7 a. The State Board of Health shall provide by rule for  
8 the temporary emergency use of beds ordinarily used  
9 for adult patients as psychiatric or chemical  
10 dependency beds for children or adolescents.

11 b. Any application to establish or operate inpatient  
12 psychiatric or drug or alcohol treatment services for  
13 persons under eighteen (18) years of age shall include  
14 the establishment, operation and maintenance of a  
15 community-based service program or a day treatment  
16 program, as those terms are defined by Section ~~1101~~ of  
17 ~~Title 10~~ 1-1-105 of Title 10A of the Oklahoma  
18 Statutes, as an integral part of the total project.

19 ~~F.~~ G. Promptly upon receipt of any such application, the  
20 Department shall examine and transmit the application to reviewers  
21 it may select to determine whether the application is complete.  
22 Once the Department has determined that the application is complete,  
23 it shall notify affected parties and other reviewing bodies and  
24 cause a thorough investigation to be made of the need for and

1 appropriateness of such expanded psychiatric or chemical dependency  
2 service. The investigation made pursuant to an application for a  
3 certificate of need shall include the following:

4 1. The adequacy of psychiatric and chemical dependency services  
5 in relation to an optimal target ratio of psychiatric or chemical  
6 dependency beds to the population;

7 2. The availability of services which may serve as alternatives  
8 or substitutes;

9 3. The adequacy of financial resources for the new or expanded  
10 services and for the continued operation thereof;

11 4. The availability of sufficient manpower to properly staff  
12 and operate the proposed new or expanded service; and

13 5. Any other matter which the Department deems appropriate.

14 ~~G.~~ H. Each application for a certificate of need applied for  
15 pursuant to the provisions of this section except for those  
16 applications filed by state agencies shall be accompanied by an  
17 application fee in an amount established by the Department.

18 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
