guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment in a county jail

2	Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such fine and
3	imprisonment. Upon conviction for a second or subsequent offense,
4	the person shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment ir

6	exceed two (2) years, or by a fine not to exceed Three Thousand
7	Dollars (\$3,000.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
8	B. As used in this section, "code official" means any code
9	enforcement official, zoning official, health official, building

11	legislation or municipal ordinance to lawfully investigate and
12	enforce such legislation or ordinance as adopted by the governing
13	body thereof.
