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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 252, O.S.L.		
17	2018 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 2-1002), is amended to read as		
18	follows:		
19	Section 2-1002. A. The Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board		
20	shall be composed of twenty (20) <u>twenty-two (22)</u> members, or their		
21	designees, as follows:		
22	1. Ten Twelve of the members shall be:		
23	a. the Attorney General or designee,		
24	b. the Chief Medical Examiner or designee,

24	prevention.	The appointed members shall include:

11	d.	a district attorney selected from a list of three

13	е.	a physician with emergency medical training selected
14		from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma

17		treatment and recovery selected from a list of three
18		names submitted by the Oklahoma Osteopathic

20	g.	a nurse selected from a list of three names submitted
21		by the Oklahoma Nurses Association,
22	h.	two individuals, at least one of whom shall be a
23		person who currently receives or formerly has been a
24		consumer of addiction recovery services related to

opioid use, selected from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, and

- i. a member of the judiciary selected from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma Supreme Court.
- B. Every two (2) years the Board shall elect from among its membership a chair and a vice-chair. The Board shall meet at least quarterly and may meet more frequently as necessary as determined by the chair. Members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for necessary travel out of funds available to the Office of the Attorney General and the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement Act; provided, that the reimbursement shall be paid in the case of state employee members by the agency employing the member.
- C. With funds appropriated or otherwise available for that purpose, the Office of the Attorney General, jointly with the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, shall provide administrative assistance and services to the Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board.
 - SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
