9	An Act relating to trespassing; amending 21 O.S.
10	2011, Section 1835, which relates to the penalty for trespassing after being forbidden; modifying
11	statutory language; providing certain exceptions; providing for allowances; providing for criminal
12	offense; providing for penalty; deleting certain definition; and providing an effective date.
13	
14	
15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2011, Section 1835, is
17	amended to read as follows:
18	Section 1835. A. Whoever shall willfully or maliciously enter
19	the garden, yard, pasture or field of another after being expressly
20	forbidden to do so or without permission by the owner or lawful
21	occupant thereof when such property is posted shall be deemed guilty
22	of trespass and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum
23	punished by a fine of not to exceed more than Two Hundred Fifty
24	Dollars (\$250.00); provided, that this provision shall not apply to

1 registered land surveyors and registered professional engineers for the purpose of land surveying in the performance of their 2 3 professional services; and, provided further, that anyone who willfully or maliciously enters any such garden, yard, pasture or 4 5 field, and therein commits or attempts to commit waste, theft, or damage shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction 6 7 thereof shall be fined in any sum not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by 8 9 confinement in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days 10 nor more than six (6) months, or both such fine and imprisonment. For purposes of this section, "posted" means exhibiting signs to 11 12 read as follows: "PROPERTY RESTRICTED"; "POSTED - KEEP OUT"; "KEEP OUT"; "NO TRESPASSING"; or similar signs which are displayed. 13 Property that is fenced or not fenced must have such signs placed 14 15 conspicuously and at all places where entry to the property is 16 normally expected.

1. This provision shall not apply to:

- a. peace officers as defined in Section 99 of this title,
- b. federal, state or local government employees engaged in the performance of their duties,
- c. firefighters, emergency medical personnel or public

 utility employees engaged in addressing an emergency

 that presents an imminent danger to health, safety or

 the environment in the performance of their duties, or

1	d. parties engaged in oil and gas operations, which shall
2	include, without limitation, exploration, drilling,
3	production and sales activities, under authority of
4	mineral ownership, an oil and gas ease, seismic
5	agreement or permit, gas gathering, purchase,
6	transportation or treating contracts, Corporation
7	Commission or other lawful authority from persons
8	entitled to give the same;
9	2. The provisions of this section shall not prohibit:
10	a. railroad employees and emergency equipment from
11	entering such land to restore rail service following
12	an accident, derailment or natural disaster,
13	b. the entrance of utility employees or contractors while
14	acting in the scope of their employment, or
15	<u>c.</u> <u>employees or contractors of valid easement or license</u>
16	holders while acting in the scope of their employment;
17	3. The following persons may enter such land of another unless
18	forbidden to do so, either orally or in writing, by the owner or
19	lawful occupier thereof:
20	a. registered land surveyors and registered professional
21	engineers for the purpose of land surveying in the
22	performance of their professional services,

1	b. persons making a delivery, selling a product or
2	service, conducting a survey or poll, working on
3	behalf of a candidate for political office, or
4	c. persons who have a legitimate reason for entering and
5	who, immediately upon entering, seek to conduct
6	business.
7	B. Anyone who willfully or maliciously enters any such land of
8	another and commits or attempts to commit waste, theft or damage
9	shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall
LO	be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a term of not
L1	less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, by a fine
12	of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred
L3	Dollars (\$500.00), or by both such fine and imprisonment.
L 4	B. C. No provisions of this act section shall be construed to
L5	conflict with Section 5-202 or 6-304 of Title 29 of the Oklahoma
16	Statutes.

18	without the prior consent of the owner or occupant thereof to so do
L9	shall be deemed guilty of trespass and upon conviction thereof shall

21	Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00); provided, that anyone who willfully
22	enters any such pecan grove and therein commits or attempts to

commit waste, theft, or damage shall be deemed guilty of a

misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum

punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by confinement imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

D. E. Whoever shall willfully or maliciously enter upon property owned or managed by the Grand River Dam Authority without permission when such property is posted shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor trespass and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum punished by a fine of not to exceed more than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00); provided, that this provision shall not apply to registered land surveyors and registered professional engineers for the purpose of land surveying in the performance of their professional services; and, provided further, that anyone who willfully or maliciously enters upon property owned or managed by the Grand River Dam Authority without permission and therein commits or attempts to commit waste, theft, or damage shall be deemed guilty of misdemeanor trespass, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum punished by a fine of not less than Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) nor more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00), or by confinement imprisonment in the county jail for not less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both such fine and imprisonment. For purposes of this section, "posted" means exhibiting signs to read as follows: "PROPERTY RESTRICTED"; "POSTED - KEEP OUT"; "KEEP OUT"; "NO TRESPASSING"; or similar signs which

8	Governor's Mansion within the State Capitol Park, as defined in
9	Section 1811.4 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes, except at a
10	place where entry to the property is normally expected shall be
11	deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined in
12	a sum punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars
13	(\$500.00), or by confinement <u>imprisonment</u> in the county jail for not
14	less than thirty (30) days nor more than six (6) months, or by both
15	such fine and imprisonment.
16	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
