9 An Act relating to higher education; allowing certain  
10 nonprofit organizations to present sex trafficking  
11 and exploitation prevention and education programs at  
12 institutions of higher education; directing  
13 institutions of higher education to provide freshman  
14 students certain opportunities to attend sex  
15 trafficking and exploitation prevention and education  
16 programs; providing topics to be included in  
17 programs; providing program materials to students,  
18 parents and legal guardians at no cost; requiring  
19 program provider to incur costs of implementing  
20 prevention and education programs and program  
21 materials; providing for codification; and providing  
22 an effective date.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

24 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 3250 of Title 70, unless there  
is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Upon the effective date of this act, the Oklahoma State  
Regents for Higher Education shall allow, if offered by nonprofit  
organizations that specialize in outreach and education programs on

1 sex trafficking and exploitation, a series of in-depth prevention  
2 and education programs regarding sex trafficking and exploitation to  
3 all freshman students enrolled at institutions of higher education  
4 within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education.

5 B. Institutions of higher education shall provide all freshman  
6 students the opportunity to attend one of three on-campus, voluntary  
7 sex trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs  
8 at any time including during freshman orientation activities, if  
9 offered by nonprofit organizations that specialize in outreach and  
10 education programs on sex trafficking and exploitation. The sex  
11 trafficking and exploitation prevention and education programs shall  
12 specifically provide students the following:

- 13 1. Definitions and nature of sex trafficking and exploitation;
- 14 2. Current laws of sex trafficking and exploitation in  
15 Oklahoma;
- 16 3. Facts and statistics of sex trafficking and exploitation in  
17 Oklahoma and throughout the United States;
- 18 4. How sex traffickers profile victims;
- 19 5. The role of online computer activity;
- 20 6. How demand is created and the industries that influence sex  
21 trafficking and exploitation;
- 22 7. How to identify a potential victim and what to do when a  
23 person identifies a victim;
- 24 8. Understanding force, fraud and coercion;

- 1           9. Understanding how traffickers groom a victim;
- 2           10. The differences between prostitution, sex trafficking and  
3 exploitation;
- 4           11. The role that pornography plays in sex trafficking and  
5 exploitation;
- 6           12. Understanding the complexities of abuse, indoctrination and  
7 manipulation;
- 8           13. Understanding the physiological makeup of a sex trafficking  
9 victim;
- 10          14. Rescuing victims of sex trafficking and exploitation; and
- 11          15. How to engage in the fight against sex trafficking and  
12 exploitation.

13          C. Program materials related to sex trafficking and  
14 exploitation prevention and education programs shall be provided at  
15 no cost to participating students and their parents and legal  
16 guardians. The program provider shall be solely responsible for  
17 incurring all costs associated with implementing prevention and  
18 education programs and related program materials.

19          SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
