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SECTION 1. NEW LAW

in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-223 of Title 11, unless there

is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The condemnation of any facility of an electric public utility

by a municipality or public trust thereof, performed upon expiration

22 or in preparation for the expiration of a franchise agreement

between electric public utility and the municipality, shall have the

effect of granting written, mutual consent to such municipal

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corporation or public trust thereof to furnish retail electric service to an electric consuming facility which is currently being served, in accordance with Section 21-121 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 190.7 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The exercise of the right of condemnation by a municipality or public trust thereof upon any electric consuming facility shall also render such facility, as defined by Section 21-121 of Title 11 of the Oklahoma Statutes and Section 190.7 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes, as not currently being served.

Any public utility that owns or operates electrical distribution facilities within the boundaries of a municipality shall allow the municipal utility or public trust thereof to furnish and deliver retail electric service across the electrical distribution facilities, at such rates, terms and conditions of service that are agreed upon by the parties. Provided, if the parties are unable to negotiate acceptable terms, the municipal utility or public trust thereof may petition the Oklahoma Corporation Commission to establish such rates, terms and conditions of service, pursuant to Section 152 of Title 17 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 21-224 of Title 11, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

For tax year 2022 and subsequent tax years, the provider of any wholesale sale of electric power to a municipal corporation or

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    public trust thereof that was not a purchaser of wholesale electric
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    power before July 1, 2021, shall pay a tax, or payment in lieu
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    thereof in the case of electric power providing agencies of this
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    state, equal to two percent (2%) of such gross sales, to this state.
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    Provided, that a publicly owned utility operating under the
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    jurisdiction of the Oklahoma Corporation Commission shall pay such
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    tax without consideration or effect upon the normal corporate income
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    tax, or any other tax, assessed against it in any taxable year.
