**Research Analysis**

HB 1135 modifies trespass without permission by allowing a landowner to place purple paint marks on posts on the property to designate the area as a “no trespass” area. Beginning on November 1, 2021, when a landowner uses the purple posting to indicate no trespassing, the marks are to be accompanied by signs placed at all places where entry to the property is normally expected explaining that the purple stripe means no trespassing, property restricted, or similar explanation. After November 1, 2022, no sign is required to explain the purple posting.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The measure provides for the placement of purple paint marks as a means to show “posting”. Provisions include size and placement provisions and a requirement to place signage as explanation of the markings (until November 1, 2022). No revenue or fiscal increases or decreases are anticipated resulting from the provisions.
