**Research Analysis**

HB1631, as introduced, requires nutrient management plans for new or expanding poultry feeding operations to be prepared by the operator or designee of the operator. The plan must be submitted to the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry for review and approval. If a plan needs to be modified, the Department shall return it to the operator.

All nutrient management plans shall be renewed, with an updated plan submitted to the Department every six years. If the Department determines the plan needs to be modified, it shall make the changes, approve the plan and notify the operator of its changes.

The measure also allows a current operator to submit a one-page amendment to the most recently submitted plan in lieu of a renewal plan.
