## **Research Analysis**

HB 1784 creates the Oklahoma Kratom Consumer Protection Act. The measure prohibits such preparation, distribution, sale, or exposure for sale kratom products that are adulterated with a nonkratom substance, contaminated with a dangerous nonkratom substance, contain a level or 7-hydroxymitragynine in the alkaloid fraction greater than 2 percent, or contain any synthetic alkaloid.

The measure requires vendors that prepare, distribute, sell, or expose for sale any food or ingredient that contains kratom or is represented to be a kratom product to disclose on the product label or a QR code linked to a website a list of ingredients and their common names; the amount of mitragynine and 7-hydroxymitragynine contained in the product and the product's packaging; the name and mailing address of the product distributor; the suggested use of the product; any necessary precautionary statements; and that the sale or transfer of kratom to a person under the age of 18 is prohibited.

Finally, the measure outlines the penalties of violation of these provisions.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

The committee substitute for HB 1784 creates a misdemeanor and a fine of not more than \$1,000. This could generate increased revenue for the state: however, this is contingent upon how many individuals are found guilty and the exact amount of the fine they are required to pay. The impact is most likely negligible for the state.
