Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB4106 requires each school district to maintain a protocol for responding to students in mental health crisis. The protocol must be created in partnership with a local mental health treatment provider. The protocol must include:

- A definition of mental health crisis
- A process for identifying a crisis
- An outline of non-punitive steps to safeguard student health and safety in response to a crisis
- A list of local treatment providers and resources
- A process for notifying parents or guardians
- A process for keeping student information private

The measure requires a school to inform a parent if their child is identified as being at risk of a mental health crisis and offer treatment referral information. Any subsequent action on behalf of the school requires parental consent except in cases of immediate life threatening behavior to the student or others.

The State Department of Education and Department of Mental Health Services are required to make a template protocol available to districts.
