**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 111 adds domestic assault and battery that results in great bodily injury to the victim, and domestic assault and battery against a known pregnant person that results in a miscarriage or injury to the unborn child, to the 85% crime list. It also changes the location of imprisonment for a person convicted of domestic abuse from a county jail to a DOC facility. This bill could result in an increase in Oklahoma's incarcerated population, however the fiscal impact is contingent on the number of people convicted of the offenses listed in the bill. Average daily cost per inmate for maximum, medium, and minimum security is \$108.17, \$61.71, and \$57.39 respectively.
