Research Analysis

The Senate amendment to HB 2272 replaces the content of the original bill with language requiring current medical marijuana business licensees and applicants to submit to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control an attestation confirming or denying the existence of any foreign financial interests in their business operation. The amended measure also requires OMMA to schedule on-site meetings and compliance inspections of business licensees within the first 180 days of licensure to verify that the licensee is actively operating or working toward operational status. If a licensee fails to provide proof that it is doing so, it will be granted two grace periods of 180 days. If the second grace period expires without proof that the licensee is operating or working toward operation, the license will be terminated.
