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L2	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L3	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 63 O.S. 2021, Section 426, is
L 4	amended to read as follows:
L5	Section 426. A. The tax on retail medical marijuana sales will
L 6	be established at seven percent (7%) of the gross amount received by
L7	the seller.
L8	B. This tax will be collected at the point of sale. Except as
L 9	provided for in subsection subsections C and D, tax proceeds will be
20	applied primarily to finance the regulatory office shall be
21	appropriated in amounts as authorized by the Oklahoma Legislature.
22	C. Except as provided for in subsection D, if For the fiscal
23	year beginning July 1, 2022, and each subsequent fiscal year,
24	proceeds from the levy authorized by subsection A of this section

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exceed the budgeted amount for running the regulatory office, any
surplus shall be apportioned with seventy-five percent (75%) going
to the General Revenue Fund and may only be expended for common
education including as follows:

- 1. Fifty-five percent (55%) of the total proceeds of the levy
  to operating the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority, but in no
  event shall the total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant
  to this paragraph exceed Thirty Six Million Dollars

  (\$36,000,000.00);
- 2. Thirty-three and three-quarters percent (33.75%) of the total proceeds of the levy to the State Public Common School

  Building Equalization Fund for the purpose of funding redbud school grants pursuant to Section 3-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma

  Statutes. Twenty-five percent (25%) shall be apportioned, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed the amount of redbud school grant funds awarded pursuant to subsection B of Section 3-104 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and
- 3. Eleven and one-quarter percent (11.25%) of the total proceeds of the levy to the Oklahoma State Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services and earmarked for drug and alcohol rehabilitation, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed Seven Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$7,500,000.00).

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- D. For fiscal year 2022, proceeds from the levy authorized by subsection A of this section shall be apportioned as follows:
- The first Sixty-five Million Dollars (\$65,000,000.00) shall be apportioned as follows:
  - fifty-nine and twenty-three hundredths percent (59.23%) to the State Public Common School Building Equalization Fund,
  - b. thirty-four and sixty-two hundredths percent (34.62%) to the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority, a division within the Oklahoma State Department of Health, and
  - six and fifteen hundredths percent (6.15%) to the C. Oklahoma State Department of Health and earmarked for drug and alcohol rehabilitation; and
- 2. Any surplus collections shall be apportioned to the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2022.
- It being immediately necessary for the preservation SECTION 3. of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
