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12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as 1743 of 21, unless there is created a
15	duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	A. No person using an Unmanned Aircraft System (UAS) or drone,
17	as defined by the Federal Aviation Administration, may, except as
18	authorized by law:
19	1. Trespass on property with intent to subject anyone to
20	eavesdropping or other surveillance in a private place;
21	2. Install in any private place, without the consent of the
22	person or persons entitled to privacy there, any device for
23	observing, photographing, recording, amplifying, or broadcasting

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sounds or events in such place, or use any such unauthorized installation;

- 3. Intentionally use a drone to photograph, record, or otherwise observe another person in a private place where the person has a reasonable expectation of privacy; or
- 4. Land a drone on the lands or waters of another resident provided the resident owns the land beneath the water body in its entirety without the owner's consent.
- B. A person who violates this act is guilty of a misdemeanor. Paragraphs 2 and 3 of subsection A of this act do not apply to law enforcement officers, or to those acting under the direction of a law enforcement officer, while engaged in the performance of the officers' lawful duties. Paragraph 3 of subsection A of this act does not apply to a drone operator operating a drone for bona fide business or bona fide government purposes who unintentionally or incidentally photographs, records, or otherwise observes another person in a private place, nor does it apply to a designated emergency management worker operating a drone within the scope of the worker's duties.
- SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.

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
