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6 AS INTRODUCED

7 An Act relating to state government; directing the
8 Office of Management and Enterprise Services to
9 contract for certain study; stating purpose of the
10 study; providing exemption from competitive bidding
11 requirements; providing for codification; and
12 providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 80.2 of Title 74, unless there
16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 A. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES)
18 shall contract for the study, analysis, and planning on the
19 feasibility of consolidating all computer systems for state, county,
20 and municipal law enforcement agencies in Oklahoma. The study shall
21 examine the cost to develop an information technology system that
22 will ensure seamless communication and data collection among the law
23 enforcement agencies and shall also:

24 1. Identify and assess the requirements for developing a
comprehensive law enforcement information technology system by

1 creating a multilayer framework that shall allow for the sharing of
2 law enforcement information;

3 2. Identify and determine the critical interfaces that have not
4 yet been captured in existing law enforcement information technology
5 systems;

6 3. Identify and review current information technology
7 capabilities of state, county, and local law enforcement entities
8 throughout the state including records management systems and
9 computer-aided dispatch systems; and

10 4. Identify and review the feasibility of consolidating data
11 collection and accessibility into fewer systems.

12 B. OMES shall be exempt from the competitive bidding
13 requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act for the purpose
14 of soliciting, negotiating, and effectuating such a contract or
15 contracts.

16 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2022.
