7 An Act relating to the Opioid Overdose Fatality
8 Review Board; amending Section 3, Chapter 252, O.S.L.
9 2018 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 2-1002), which
relates to composition of Board; modifying
composition; and providing an effective date.

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12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

13 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 252, O.S.L.
14 2018 (63 O.S. Supp. 2020, Section 2-1002), is amended to read as
15 follows:

16 Section 2-1002. A. The Opioid Overdose Fatality Review Board
17 shall be composed of ~~twenty (20)~~ twenty-one (21) members, or their
18 designees, as follows:

- 19 1. ~~Ten~~ Eleven of the members shall be:
- 20 a. the Attorney General or designee,
 - 21 b. the Chief Medical Examiner or designee,
 - 22 c. the State Commissioner of Health or designee,
 - 23 d. the Chief of Injury Prevention Services of the State
24 Department of Health or designee,
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- e. the President of the Oklahoma State Medical Association or designee,
- f. the Director of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control or designee,
- g. the Commissioner of the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services or designee,
- h. the President of the Oklahoma Osteopathic Association or designee,
- i. the Director of the Department of Human Services or designee, ~~and~~
- j. the Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation or designee, and
- k. the President of the Association of Oklahoma Narcotic Enforcers or designee; and

2. Ten of the members shall be appointed by the Attorney General, shall serve for terms of two (2) years and shall be eligible for reappointment. The members shall be persons having training and experience in matters related to opioid abuse and prevention. The appointed members shall include:

- a. a county sheriff selected from a list of three names submitted by the executive board of the Oklahoma Sheriffs' Association,

- 1 b. a chief of a municipal police department selected from
2 a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma
3 Association of Chiefs of Police,
4 c. an attorney licensed in this state who is in private
5 practice selected from a list of three names submitted
6 by the Board of Governors of the Oklahoma Bar
7 Association,
8 d. a district attorney selected from a list of three
9 names submitted by the District Attorneys Council,
10 e. a physician with emergency medical training selected
11 from a list of three names submitted by the Oklahoma
12 State Medical Association,
13 f. a physician with experience in drug addiction
14 treatment and recovery selected from a list of three
15 names submitted by the Oklahoma Osteopathic
16 Association,
17 g. a nurse selected from a list of three names submitted
18 by the Oklahoma Nurses Association,
19 h. two individuals, at least one of whom shall be a
20 person who currently receives or formerly has been a
21 consumer of addiction recovery services related to
22 opioid use, selected from a list of three names
23 submitted by the ~~Oklahoma~~ Department of Mental Health
24 and Substance Abuse Services, and

1 i. a member of the judiciary selected from a list of
2 three names submitted by the Oklahoma Supreme Court.

3 B. Every two (2) years the Board shall elect from among its
4 membership a chair and a vice-chair. The Board shall meet at least
5 quarterly and may meet more frequently as necessary as determined by
6 the chair. Members shall serve without compensation but may be
7 reimbursed for necessary travel out of funds available to the Office
8 of the Attorney General and the Department of Mental Health and
9 Substance Abuse Services, pursuant to the State Travel Reimbursement
10 Act; provided, that the reimbursement shall be paid in the case of
11 state employee members by the agency employing the member.

12 C. With funds appropriated or otherwise available for that
13 purpose, the Office of the Attorney General, jointly with the
14 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services, shall
15 provide administrative assistance and services to the Opioid
16 Overdose Fatality Review Board.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.

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
