Harmful woody species include, but are not limited to, Juniperus
virginiana (eastern red cedar), Juniperus scopulorum (Rocky Mountain
juniper), Juniperus monosperma (one-seed juniper), Juniperus
pinchotii (redberry juniper), Juniperus ashei (ashe juniper),

Prosopis glandulosa (honey mesquite), and Tamarix ramosissima (salt
```

cedar).

This removal and eradication of these harmful woody species shall begin January 1, 2025 and will remove and eradicate twenty (20%) percent of the harmful and woody species each year on identified acreages through December 31, 2029. It being the intent to remove all of the harmful woody species on the identified acreages at the end of the five (5) year period.

B. The Commissioners of the Land Office may fund this removal and eradication program through donations from organizations, individuals, and corporations supporting improved habitat for wildlife or livestock production, as well as through grants from federal agencies, and from all other funding that is available to the Commissioners of the Land Office.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
