Barker Memorial Highway; modifying name of memorial; directing markers be placed; providing for codification; and providing an 3 effective date. 4 5 6 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: A new section of law to be codified 8 SECTION 1. NEW LAW 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.398 of Title 69, unless 10 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: The intersection of U.S. Highway 77, also known as the Broadway 11 12 Extension, and Comfort Drive in Edmond, in Oklahoma County shall be 13 designated as the "SGT Christopher James "CJ" Nelson Memorial 14 Intersection". The Department of Transportation shall cause 15 suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed at the 16 intersection. 17 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 18 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.399 of Title 69, unless 19 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 20 The section of U.S. Highway 62 beginning at the intersection of 21 State Highway 6 extending east to the intersection of U.S. Highway 22 283 in Altus, in Jackson County shall be designated as the "Trooper 23 John R. Barter Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation 24

shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be
 placed on the highway.

3 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.400 of Title 69, unless
5 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

6 The section of U.S. Highway 271 beginning at the south edge of 7 Antlers extending south to the intersection of Airport Road in 8 Pushmataha County shall be designated as the "Trooper Don Henley 9 Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause 10 suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the 11 highway.

12 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.401 of Title 69, unless 14 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge crossing over E 76th Street on U.S. Highway 169 in Owasso, in Tulsa County shall be designated as the "Bobbi White Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

20 SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 21 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.402 of Title 69, unless 22 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 23 The section of U.S. Highway 60 just east of the Will Rogers 24 Turnpike entrance in Vinita extending easterly to the intersection

of State Highway 82 South in Craig County shall be designated as the
 "Bataan Death March Survivor Elmer "Red" Vanover Memorial Highway".
 The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent
 markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

5 SECTION 6. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 6 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.403 of Title 69, unless 7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

8 The section of U.S. Highway 60 beginning at the intersection of 9 South Kamo Drive extending northeasterly through Vinita to the west 10 side of the Will Rogers Turnpike entrance in Craig County shall be 11 designated as the "Bronze Star Recipient Marine Sgt. Justin Lee 12 Noyes, KIA Iraq, Memorial Highway". The Department of 13 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that 14 name to be placed on the highway.

15 SECTION 7. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.404 of Title 69, unless 17 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 18 The section of State Highway 56 beginning at the south edge of 19 Wewoka extending north to the northern limits of Wewoka, in Seminole 20 County shall be designated as the "Seminole Warrior John Horse 21 Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause 22 suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the 23 highway.

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1SECTION 8.NEW LAWA new section of law to be codified2in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.405 of Title 69, unless3there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 33 beginning at the intersection of
State Highway 18 North in Cushing extending west two miles in Payne
County shall be designated as the "William A. Ahrberg Memorial
Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable
permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

9 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.406 of Title 69, unless 10 11 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 12 The bridge located on U.S. Highway 59 one-half (1/2) mile south 13 of Panama in Leflore County shall be designated as the "Specialist 14 Robert Allan Pierce Memorial Bridge". The Department of 15 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that 16 name to be placed on the bridge.

SECTION 10. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.407 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge crossing over U.S. Highway 75 on U.S. Highway 60 in Bartlesville, Washington County shall be designated as the "Dr. James R. McFarland Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

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1 SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.408 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 3 The section of State Highway 30 beginning just north of the 4 5 intersection of E 1060 Road extending north to the intersection of State Highway 47 in Roger Mills County shall be designated as the 6 7 "MSgt. JW Easterling Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that 8 9 name to be placed on the highway.

10 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.409 of Title 69, unless 12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 13 The section of State Highway 48A beginning at the intersection

The section of State Highway 48A beginning at the intersection of State Highway 48A South (Wiley Corner) extending east through the community of Fillmore in Johnston County shall be designated as the "CW4 Wendell Carroll LaFevers Memorial Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 13. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.410 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 34 beginning at the north edge of the town of Carter extending north to the intersection of State Highway 152 in Beckham County shall be designated as the "Colonel

George Henry Normand Memorial Highway". The Department of
 Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that
 name to be placed on the highway.

4 SECTION 14. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.411 of Title 69, unless 6 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

7 The section of U.S. Highway 60 beginning at the intersection of 8 U.S. Highway 283 extending three (3) miles westerly through the town 9 of Arnett to the intersection of S. Road 1790 in Ellis County shall 10 be designated as the "Marshal George Wilson Reddick Memorial 11 Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable 12 permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

SECTION 15. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.412 of Title 69, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The section of State Highway 18 beginning at Black Bear Creek on the north edge of Pawnee extending north to the intersection of the State Highway 15 shall be designated as the "CDR Ernest Evans, First Tribal Recipient of the Medal of Honor, Memorial Trail". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

22 SECTION 16. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.413 of Title 69, unless 24 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 The intersection of State Highway 77H and S.E. 134th Street in 2 Cleveland County shall be designated as the "Emily Gaines Memorial Intersection". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable 3 4 permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway. 5 SECTION 17. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.414 of Title 69, unless 6 7 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: The section of U.S. Highway 277 on the west side of the H.E. 8 9 Bailey Turnpike and extending west to the intersection of U.S. 10 Highway 62 in Comanche County shall be designated as the "Gold Star

14SECTION 18.NEW LAWA new section of law to be codified15in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1698.415 of Title 69, unless16there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The bridge over Wewoka Creek on U.S. Highway 270 approximately six (6) miles west of the State Highway 56 intersection in Wewoka, Seminole County shall be designated as the "Col. George H. Massad Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

23 SECTION 19. AMENDATORY 69 O.S. 2021, Section 1698.305, 24 is amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 1698.305 The bridge located on section of State Highway 2 37 one-half (0.5) mile west of the Stillwater Central Railroad crossing in beginning one (1) mile west of the intersection of State 3 4 Highway 92 extending east through the town of Tuttle two and one-5 half (2 1/2) miles in Grady County shall be designated as the "Thelma "Chincie" Ross WWII Chickasaw Code Talker Memorial Bridge 6 7 Highway". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the highway. 8 9 SECTION 20. AMENDATORY Section 4, Chapter 356, O.S.L. 2022 (69 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 1698.367), is amended to read as 10 follows: 11

Section 1698.367 The bridge crossing over the Turner Turnpike located on State Highway 18 at the north edge of Chandler in Lincoln County shall be designated as the "<u>Purple Heart Recipient</u> SGT Ronald <u>M. Crews Vietnam Veteran</u> Bridge". The Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be placed on the bridge.

18 SECTION 21. AMENDATORY Section 28, Chapter 356, O.S.L. 19 2022 (69 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 1698.391), is amended to read as 20 follows:

Section 1698.391 The bridge over the Canadian River on Interstate 40 in Canadian County shall be designated as the "Cecil <u>A.</u> Davis <u>Sr.</u> Memorial Bridge". The Department of Transportation 24

shall cause suitable permanent markers bearing that name to be
 placed on the bridge.

3 SECTION 22. AMENDATORY Section 32, Chapter 356, O.S.L.
4 2022 (69 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 1698.395), is amended to read as
5 follows:

6 Section 1698.395 The section of U.S. Highway 277 beginning at 7 the intersection of Keeney Road near Elgin extending northeasterly 8 to the H.E. Bailey Turnpike overpass in Comanche County shall be 9 designated as the "Captain Mark A. E. Barker Memorial Highway". The 10 Department of Transportation shall cause suitable permanent markers 11 bearing that name to be placed on the highway.

12 SECTION 23. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023. 13

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
