21 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
22 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6060.3b of Title 36, unless
23 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 1. "Contraceptive drugs" means all drugs approved by the United
2 States Food and Drug Administration that are used to prevent
3 pregnancy, including, but not limited to, hormonal drugs
4 administered orally, transdermally, and intravaginally, but excludes
5 medications that could be used to terminate an existing pregnancy;

7 2. "Health benefit plan" means a health benefit plan as defined
8 pursuant to Section 6060.4 of Title 36 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

9 B. Any health benefit plan that is offered, issued, or renewed
10 on and after the effective date of this act that offers coverage for
11 contraceptive drugs shall provide coverage for an enrollee to
12 obtain:

13 1. A three-month supply of a contraceptive drug at once the
14 first time the enrollee obtains the drug; and

15 2. A twelve-month supply of the contraceptive drug at once each
16 subsequent time that the enrollee obtains the same drug, regardless
17 of whether the enrollee was enrolled in the health benefit plan the
18 first time that the enrollee obtained the drug.

19 An enrollee may obtain only one twelve-month supply of a covered
20 prescription drug during each twelve-month period.

21 C. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit an
22 enrollee of a health benefit plan from requesting a smaller supply
23 or to prohibit a prescribing provider from prescribing a smaller
24

2 medical appropriateness.

3 D. Nothing in this section shall be construed to require
4 coverage under a health benefit plan for any contraceptive drug that
5 is not intended for regular or routine use.

6 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024."
