9 An Act relating to daylight saving time; enabling
10 Oklahoma to adopt daylight saving time as the year-
11 round time upon certain authorization; construing
12 provisions; providing for codification; and providing
13 a conditional effective date.

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 90.28 of Title 25, unless there
17 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

18 A. If a federal law is passed that authorizes states to observe
19 daylight saving time year-round, this state shall adopt daylight
20 saving time as the year-round standard of time for the entire state
21 and all its political subdivisions.

22 B. This section shall not be construed to affect the standard
23 time established by federal law governing the movement of common
24 carriers engaged in interstate commerce or the time for performance

1 of an act by an officer or department of the United States, as
2 established by a statute, lawful order, rule, or regulation of the
3 United States or an agency thereof.

4 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon the enactment of a
5 federal law that permits states to enter upon and permanently
6 observe daylight saving time.
