14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:				
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 24-102, is				
16	amended to read as follows:				
17	Section 24-102. <u>A.</u> The superintendent, principal, teacher, or				
18	security personnel of any public school in the State of Oklahoma,				
19	upon reasonable suspicion, shall have the authority to detain and				
20	search or authorize the search, of any pupil or property in the				
21	possession of the pupil when said the pupil is on any school				
22	premises, or while in transit under the authority of the school, or				
23	while attending any function sponsored or authorized by the school,				
24	for dangerous weapons, controlled dangerous substances, as defined				

1 in the Uniform Controlled Dangerous Substances Act, intoxicating alcoholic beverages, low-point beer, as defined by Section 163.2 of 2 Title 37 of the Oklahoma Statutes in the Oklahoma Alcoholic Beverage 3 4 Control Act, or for missing or stolen property if said the property 5 be is reasonably suspected to have been taken from a pupil, a school employee or the school during school activities. The search shall 6 7 be conducted by a person of the same sex as the person being searched and shall be witnessed by at least one other authorized 8 9 person, said person to be of the same sex if practicable.

10 The extent of any search conducted pursuant to this section в. 11 shall be reasonably related to the objective of the search and not excessively intrusive in light of the age and sex of the student and 12 the nature of the infraction. In no event shall a strip search of a 13 14 student be allowed. No student's clothing, except cold weather 15 outerwear, shoes, and hand and head coverings, except religious head 16 coverings, shall be removed prior to or during the conduct of any 17 warrantless search.

18 <u>C.</u> The superintendent, principal, teacher, or security 19 personnel searching or authorizing the search shall have authority 20 to detain the pupil to be searched and to preserve any dangerous 21 weapons, controlled dangerous substances, <u>intoxicating alcoholic</u> 22 beverages, <u>low-point beer</u>, or missing or stolen property that might 23 be in the pupil's possession including the authority to authorize 24 any other persons they deem necessary to restrain such pupil or to

preserve any dangerous weapons, controlled dangerous substances, intoxicating <u>alcoholic</u> beverages, <u>low-point beer</u>, or missing or stolen property. Students found to be in possession of such an item shall be subject to the provisions of Section 24-101.3 of this title.

6 Pupils shall not have any reasonable expectation of privacy D. 7 towards school administrators or teachers in the contents of a 8 school locker, desk, or other school property. School personnel 9 shall have access to school lockers, desks, and other school 10 property in order to properly supervise the welfare of pupils. 11 School lockers, desks, and other areas of school facilities may be 12 opened and examined by school officials at any time and no reason 13 shall be necessary for such search. Schools shall inform pupils in 14 the student discipline code that they have no reasonable expectation 15 of privacy rights towards school officials in school lockers, desks, 16 or other school property.

17 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
