14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1040.75, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1040.75 As used in Sections 1040.75 through 1040.77 of
18	this title:
19	1. "Minor" means any unmarried person under the age of eighteen
20	(18) years;
21	2. "Harmful to minors" means:
22	a. that quality of any description, exhibition,
23	presentation or representation, in whatever form, of
24	nudity, sexual conduct, sexual excitement, or

sadomasochistic abuse when the material or performance, taken as a whole, has the following characteristics:

- (1) the average person eighteen (18) years of age or older applying contemporary community standards would find that the material or performance has a predominant tendency to appeal to a prurient interest in sex to minors, and
- 9 (2)the average person eighteen (18) years of age or 10 older applying contemporary community standards 11 would find that the material or performance 12 depicts or describes nudity, sexual conduct, 13 sexual excitement or sadomasochistic abuse in a 14 manner that is patently offensive to prevailing 15 standards in the adult community with respect to 16 what is suitable for minors, and
- 17 (3) the material or performance lacks serious
 18 literary, scientific, medical, artistic, or
 19 political value for minors, or
- 20 b. any description, exhibition, presentation or
 21 representation, in whatever form, of inappropriate
 22 violence;

3. "Inappropriate violence" means any description or
 representation, in an interactive video game or computer software,

1 of violence which, taken as a whole, has the following 2 characteristics:

- a. the average person eighteen (18) years of age or older
 applying contemporary community standards would find
 that the interactive video game or computer software
 is patently offensive to prevailing standards in the
 adult community with respect to what is suitable for
 minors, and
- 9 b. the interactive video game or computer software lacks
 10 serious literary, scientific, medical, artistic, or
 11 political value for minors based on, but not limited
 12 to, the following criteria:
 - (1) is glamorized or gratuitous,
 - (2) is graphic violence used to shock or stimulate,
 - (3) is graphic violence that is not contextually relevant to the material,
- 17 (4) is so pervasive that it serves as the thread
 18 holding the plot of the material together,
- 19 (5) trivializes the serious nature of realistic
 20 violence,
 - (6) does not demonstrate the consequences or effectsof realistic violence,
- (7) uses brutal weapons designed to inflict the

14	5. "Sexual conduct" means acts of masturbation, homosexuality,

16	unclothed genitals, pubic area, buttocks, or, if such person be a
17	female, breast, or fellatio, cunnilingus, anal intercourse, or any
18	other intrusion, however slight, of any part of a person's body or
19	of any object into the genital or anal openings of another person's
20	body, or depictions or descriptions of sexual bestiality,
21	sadomasochism, masturbation, or excretory functions;
22	6. "Sexual excitement" means the condition of human male or
23	female genitals when in a state of sexual stimulation or arousal;

7. "Sadomasochistic abuse" means flagellation or torture by or
 upon a person clothed or naked or the condition of being fettered,
 bound or otherwise physically restrained on the part of one so
 clothed or naked;

"Material" means anything tangible that is capable of being used or adapted to arouse prurient interest, whether through the 6 7 medium of reading, observation, sound, or in any other manner including, but not limited to, anything printed or written, any 8 9 book, magazine, newspaper, pamphlet, poster, print, picture, figure, 10 image, description, drawing, pictorial representation, motion 11 picture film, record, recording tape, CD-ROM disk, Magnetic Disk 12 Memory, Magnetic Tape Memory, photograph, video tape, computer 13 software or video disk, film, transparency, slide, audiotape, audio 14 disk, computer tape, video game, or any other medium used to 15 electronically produce or reproduce images on a screen, or any 16 mechanical, chemical, or electronic reproduction. Material includes 17 undeveloped photographs, molds, printing plates, and other latent 18 representational objects whether or not processing or other acts are 19 required to make the content of the material apparent; 20 9. "CD-ROM" means a compact disk with read only memory which 21 has the capacity to store audio, video and written materials and may 22 be used by computer to play or display materials harmful to minors; 23

- 10. "Magnetic Disk Memory" means a memory system that stores
- 24 and retrieves binary data on record-like metal or plastic disks

1 coated with a magnetic material, including but not limited to floppy
2 diskettes;

3 11. "Magnetic Tape Memory" means a memory system that stores 4 and retrieves binary data on magnetic recording tape;

12. "Performance" means any motion picture, film, video tape,
played record, phonograph or tape, preview, trailer, play, show,
skit, dance, or other exhibition performed or presented to or before
an audience of one or more, with or without consideration;

9 <u>13.</u> <u>10.</u> "Knowingly" means having general knowledge of, or 10 reason to know, or a belief or ground for belief which warrants 11 further inspection or inquiry of both:

a. the character and content of any material or
 performance which is reasonably susceptible of
 examination by the defendant, and

15 the age of the minor. However, an honest mistake, b. 16 shall constitute an excuse from liability pursuant to this act if the defendant made a reasonable bona fide 17 18 attempt to ascertain the true age of such minor; 19 14. 11. "Person" means any individual, partnership, 20 association, corporation, or other legal entity of any kind; and 21 15. 12. "A reasonable bona fide attempt" means an attempt to 22 ascertain the true age of the minor by requiring production of a 23 driver license, marriage license, birth certificate or other

SECTION 2. 21 O.S. 2021, Section 1040.76, is 3 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 4 5 Section 1040.76 The Legislature finds that protecting minor children from overtly sexual and violent content is a legitimate 6 7 objective that should be actively enforced. The Legislature further finds that the protection of the right 8 9 of the people to engage in the freedom of speech and expression is a 10 sacred right in the United States; however, such performances and 11 materials may not contain depictions of sexual conduct, nudity, or 12 inappropriate violence which are harmful to minor children. 13 Therefore, it is the intent of the Legislature that these 14 provisions be diligently enforced to protect minor children while 15 also protecting the free speech rights of the public. 16 No person, including but not limited to any persons having 17 custody, control or supervision of any commercial establishment, 18 shall knowingly: 19 1. Display material which is harmful to minors in such a way 20 that minors, as a part of the invited general public, will be 21 exposed to view such material. Provided, however, a person shall be
