1"SECTION 1.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101.42,2is amended to read as follows:

Section 6-101.42 A. For the 2023-24 school year, each school 3 4 district shall provide to every support employee a wage increase 5 over the base amount the employee earned during the 2022-23 school year if the support employee is employed by the same school district 6 7 for the 2023-24 school year in an amount equal to a six percent (6%) increase of the base amount. The dollar amount of salary increase 8 9 required by this subsection shall be prorated based upon the number 10 of total hours of work performed by a full-time-equivalent support 11 employee.

12 B. For the 2018-19 school year, each school district shall 13 provide to every support employee a wage increase over the base 14 amount the employee earned during the 2017-18 school year if the 15 support employee is employed by the same school district for the 16 2018-19 school year in the amount of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty 17 Dollars (\$1,250.00). The dollar amount of salary increase 18 authorized by this subsection shall be prorated based upon the 19 number of total hours of work performed by a full-time-equivalent 20 support employee.

21 B. C. The increase increases prescribed by this section shall 22 be in addition to any other compensation and fringe benefits 23 provided by the district, or mandated by law or collective

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bargaining agreement, unless the hours or duties of the support
 employee are reduced proportionately.

3 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 4 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.15 of Title 70, unless 5 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year, certified
personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
Statutes, in the public schools of Oklahoma shall receive in salary
and/or fringe benefits not less than the amounts specified in the
following schedule:

7 2. If a school district intends to provide retirement benefits to a teacher such that the teacher's salary would be less than the 8 9 amounts set forth in the Minimum Salary Schedule specified in 10 subsection A of this section, the district shall be required to 11 provide written notification to the teacher prior to his or her 12 employment or, if already employed by the district, no later than thirty (30) days prior to the date the district elects to provide 13 14 retirement benefits such that the teacher's salary would be less 15 than the Minimum Salary Schedule.

16 C. Any of the degrees referred to in this section shall be from 17 a college recognized by the State Board of Education. The Board 18 shall accept teaching experience from out-of-state school districts 19 that are accredited by the State Board of Education or appropriate 20 state accrediting agency for the districts. The Board shall accept 21 teaching experience from out-of-country schools that are accredited 22 or otherwise endorsed by the appropriate national or regional 23 accrediting or endorsement authority. Out-of-country certification 24 documentation in a language other than English shall be analyzed by

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1 an educational credential evaluation service in accordance with 2 industry standards and guidelines and approved by the State Department of Education. The person seeking to have credit granted 3 for out-of-country teaching experience shall be responsible for all 4 5 costs of the analysis by a credential evaluation service. The Board shall accept teaching experience from primary and secondary schools 6 7 that are operated by the United States Department of Defense or are affiliated with the United States Department of State. 8

9 D. For the purpose of state salary increments and retirement, 10 no teacher shall be granted credit for more than five (5) years of 11 active duty in the military service or out-of-state or out-of-12 country teaching experience as a certified teacher or its 13 equivalent. Nothing in this section shall prohibit boards of 14 education from crediting more years of experience on district salary 15 schedules than those allowed for state purposes.

16 E. The State Board of Education shall recognize, for purposes 17 of certification and salary increments, all the years of experience 18 of a:

Certified teacher who teaches in the educational program of
 the Department of Corrections, beginning with fiscal year 1981;

21 2. Vocational rehabilitation counselor under the Department of
22 Human Services if the counselor was employed as a certified teacher
23 by the State Department of Education when the Division of Vocational
24 Rehabilitation was transferred from the State Board of Career and

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Technology Education or the State Board of Education to the Oklahoma
 Public Welfare Commission on July 1, 1968;

3 3. Vocational rehabilitation counselor which were completed
4 while employed by the Department of Human Services if such counselor
5 was certified as a teacher or was eligible for certification as a
6 teacher in Oklahoma;

7 4. Certified teacher which were completed while employed by the
8 Child Study Center located at University Hospital, if the teacher
9 was certified as a teacher in Oklahoma; and

10 5. Certified school psychologist or psychometrist which were 11 completed while employed as a doctoral intern, psychological 12 assistant, or psychologist with any agency of the State of Oklahoma 13 if the experience primarily involved work with persons of school- or 14 preschool-age and if the person was, at the time the experience was 15 acquired, certified as, or eligible for certification as, a school 16 psychologist or psychometrist.

F. The provisions of this section shall not apply to teachers who have entered into postretirement employment with a public school in Oklahoma and are still receiving a monthly retirement benefit.

G. If a person employed as certified personnel, as defined in Section 26-103 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes, by a school district during the 2022-2023 school year was receiving a salary above the step level indicated by the state Minimum Salary Schedule for the 2022-2023 school year, the person shall receive a salary

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1	increase amount equal to the amount indicated in subsection A of
2	this section for the step level indicated for the person, provided
3	they remain employed by the same district, unless the hours or the
4	duties of the certified personnel are reduced proportionately.
5	SECTION 3. REPEALER 70 O.S. 2021, Section 18-114.14, is
6	hereby repealed."
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
