NEW LAW 15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1381 of Title 22, unless there 16 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 17 Notwithstanding any other provision of law concerning 18 postconviction relief, a district attorney in the jurisdiction in 19 which a person was convicted of an offense may file a motion in the 20 district court to vacate or set aside a judgment of conviction at 21 any time if clear and convincing evidence exists establishing that 22 the defendant was convicted of an offense that the defendant did not 23

1	commit. The district court shall have jurisdiction and authority to
2	consider, hear, and decide the motion.
3	SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
4	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
5	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
6	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
