11	offer lower division classes; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4662, which relates to Oklahoma State
12	University-Tulsa; allowing the institution to offer certain lower division courses; amending 70 O.S.
13	2021, Section 4667, which relates to the Langston University Branch in Tulsa; updating statutory
14	reference; allowing the institution to offer certain lower division courses; removing language prohibiting
15	Oklahoma State University-Tulsa from duplicating certain programs offered by the Langston University Dranch in Tulas, amonding 70.0 C 2021 Section 4668
16	Branch in Tulsa; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4668, which relates to the Northeastern State University branch in Broken Arrow; allowing the institution to
17	offer certain lower division courses; removing language prohibiting Oklahoma State University-Tulsa
18	from duplicating certain programs offered by the Northeastern State University branch in Broken Arrow;
19	clarifying references; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section
20	4669, which relates to Rogers State University; removing language directing the institution to
21	contract specifically with certain institution; repealing 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4665, which relates
22	to prohibiting duplication of certain courses offered by Tulsa Community College; updating statutory
23	language; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

³ SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3213.1, is ⁴ amended to read as follows:

Section 3213.1. A. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall make educational program resources at institutions in The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education available to the people in the Ponca City area. This program shall be known as the University Center at Ponca City.

10 The State Regents shall draw upon the educational programs Β. 11 of institutions best suited to provide the kind of educational 12 programs needed and shall, in pursuance of Article XIII-A of the 13 Constitution of Oklahoma and appropriate statutes, set the standards 14 of education as they relate to the programs operated to assure that 15 credits earned by students will be fully accepted at institutions of 16 higher education to which the students may transfer the credit to 17 apply toward an educational study objective. Northern Oklahoma 18 College shall have exclusive authority to offer all lower division 19 courses and programs at the University Center at Ponca City as 20 listed in the current college catalog of Northern Oklahoma College. 21 The State Regents may establish appropriate funds and С. 22 accounts $_{\tau}$ including a revolving fund $_{\tau}$ in the Office of State Finance 23 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for servicing the

fiscal operations of the University Center at Ponca City.

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The funds

and accounts shall be subject to the direct supervision, management, and control of the board of trustees created by subsection D of this section. The people locally shall provide suitable physical plant accommodations for the University Center at Ponca City.

5 There is hereby created a board of nine (9) trustees to be D. 6 appointed by the Governor by and with the consent of the Senate to 7 serve as the administrative agency for the University Center at 8 Ponca City. The board shall be a body corporate and shall adopt and 9 use an official seal. The board so created shall have the authority 10 to submit a budget annually to the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 11 Education, administer monies budgeted by the State Regents, provide 12 educational facilities, recommend courses and programs to be offered 13 by participating institutions, select a chief executive officer 14 whose duties include the general coordination of approved programs 15 and services, and the selection of other appropriate nonteaching 16 personnel. The board of trustees is authorized to expend all monies 17 allocated to the University Center at Ponca City as may be necessary 18 to perform the duties and responsibilities imposed upon the board by 19 this section. For purposes of acquiring and taking title to real 20 and personal property from sources other than state appropriations, 21 the board is authorized to enter into contracts and to adopt rules 22 and regulations pertaining to such actions. The initial nine (9) 23 members shall serve their terms for the period to which originally

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1	appointed, in numbered positions having dates of expiration
2	identical to the dates of expiration of the original appointments:
3	Position No. 1. The term of office of one member shall expire
4	on June 30, 2013, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
5	Position No. 2. The term of office of one member shall expire
6	on June 30, 2014, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
7	Position No. 3. The term of office of one member shall expire
8	on June 30, 2015, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
9	Position No. 4. The term of office of one member shall expire
10	on June 30, 2016, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
11	Position No. 5. The term of office of one member shall expire
12	on June 30, 2017, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
13	Position No. 6. The term of office of one member shall expire
14	on June 30, 2018, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
15	Position No. 7. The term of office of one member shall expire
16	on June 30, 2019, and each nine (9) years thereafter;
17	Position No. 8. The term of office of one member shall expire
18	on June 30, 2020, and each nine (9) years thereafter; and
19	Position No. 9. The term of office of one member shall expire
20	on June 30, 2021, and each nine (9) years thereafter.
21	The board shall organize and elect a chair, vice-chair <u>vice</u>
22	chair, and secretary annually.
23	E. The board of trustees may establish and maintain plans for
24 27	tenure and retirement of its employees and for payment of deferred

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¹ compensation of employees and may provide hospital and medical ² benefits, accident, health and life insurance, and annuity contracts ³ for employees and pay for all or part of the cost with funds ⁴ available for payment of its operating expenses.

F. The board may establish with the State Treasurer any accounts as are necessary to operate retirement, deferred compensation, or benefits plans for its employees. The accounts shall be revolving funds not subject to fiscal year limitations. Funds deposited in the accounts may be invested in any of the types of instruments in which the State Treasurer is authorized by law to invest.

SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 3405.1, is amended to read as follows:

Section 3405.1. A. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall make resident college credit courses and programs available to the people of Muskogee.

B. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall provide lower division classes and programs through a branch of Connors State College, which shall be established and located in Muskogee. The branch campus of Connors State College shall be governed by the Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical Colleges and administered through Connors State College.

C. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall
provide upper division classes and programs and graduate classes at

¹ the Masters level <u>and may offer lower division classes and programs</u> ² through a branch of Northeastern State University, which shall be ³ established and located at Muskogee. The branch campus of ⁴ Northeastern State University shall be governed by the Board of ⁵ Regents of Oklahoma Colleges and administered through Northeastern ⁶ State University.

7 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4662, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 4662. On January 1, 1999, there shall be established as 10 a successor to Rogers University in Tulsa a branch institution of 11 Oklahoma State University which shall be known as Oklahoma State 12 University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-Tulsa and shall offer 13 upper division undergraduate courses and baccalaureate degree 14 programs and may offer lower division undergraduate courses and 15 baccalaureate degree programs. No later than July 1, 2001, the 16 Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and Mechanical 17 Colleges, in cooperation with the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 18 Education, shall have developed and implemented programs leading to 19 baccalaureate degrees that can be earned at Oklahoma State 20 University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-Tulsa. Beginning with 21 the 2001 - 2002 academic year, degrees earned at Oklahoma State 22 University/Tulsa Oklahoma State University-Tulsa shall be designated 23 as awarded by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education acting 24 through Oklahoma State University; provided that dual degree _ _

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¹ programs may be offered at Oklahoma State University/Tulsa <u>Oklahoma</u> ² <u>State University-Tulsa</u> and dual degrees may be awarded through ³ Oklahoma State University and other institutions.

⁴ SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4667, is ⁵ amended to read as follows:

6 Section 4667. On July 1, 2001, there shall be established a 7 branch of Langston University within the Tulsa metropolitan area 8 consistent with the statewide plan for Langston University as 9 provided in Section 6 of this act Section 4666 of this title. 10 Langston University shall continue to meet the missions and programs 11 of the Langston Urban Center in Tulsa. The Oklahoma State Regents 12 for Higher Education are authorized to make lower division and upper 13 division undergraduate and graduate course offerings at the Langston 14 University Branch in Tulsa available as the State Regents shall 15 determine are appropriate. Undergraduate degree programs offered 16 through Oklahoma State University/Tulsa shall not duplicate those 17 undergraduate degree programs offered by Langston University Branch 18 in Tulsa, as determined by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 19 Education and shall be consistent with and in furthering 20 implementation of the statewide plan for Langston University as 21 developed by the State Regents pursuant to Section 6 of this act and 22 filed with the Office for Civil Rights, United States Department of 23 Education.

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1 The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall fund 2 Langston University at a level not less than its fiscal year 1998 3 level, and its Education and General Budget shall be held harmless 4 from reductions in succeeding years. The Oklahoma State Regents for 5 Higher Education shall allocate funds to Langston University 6 sufficient to fund full time faculty in Tulsa at a level equal to 7 seventy percent (70%) of its faculty level that existed in Tulsa in 8 fiscal year 1998 and adequate building and classroom space which 9 were funded in fiscal year 1998 in order to carry out all functions 10 in Tulsa. The Board of Regents for the Oklahoma Agricultural and 11 Mechanical Colleges shall allocate space for Langston University in 12 Tulsa.

It is the intent of the Legislature that Langston University be funded at a level consistent with the average allocation and allotment of the institutions in the regional funding tier as established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

Beginning with the 2001 - 2002 academic year, degrees earned at Langston University Branch in Tulsa shall be designated as awarded by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education acting through Langston University.

SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4668, is amended to read as follows:

Section 4668. On July 1, 2001, there may be established a
branch of Northeastern State University within the Tulsa

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1 metropolitan area. The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education 2 are authorized to make lower division and upper division 3 undergraduate and graduate course offerings at the Northeastern 4 State University branch in Broken Arrow available as the State 5 Regents shall determine are appropriate. Undergraduate degree 6 programs offered through Oklahoma State University/Tulsa shall not 7 duplicate those undergraduate degree programs offered by 8 Northeastern State University in Tulsa, as determined by the 9 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

The Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall fund Northeastern State University at a level not less than its fiscal year 1998 level, and its Education and General Budget shall be held harmless from reductions in succeeding years.

It is the intent of the Legislature that Northeastern State
University <u>in Broken Arrow</u> be funded at a level consistent with the
average allocation and allotment of the institutions in the regional
funding tier as established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
Education.

Beginning with the 2001 - 2002 academic year, degrees earned at the Northeastern State University Branch branch in Tulsa Broken Arrow shall be designated as awarded by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education acting through Northeastern State University. SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4669, is amended to read as follows:

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1 Section 4669. A. On January 1, 1999, there shall be created in 2 Claremore, Oklahoma, and its other regionally accredited sites, as a 3 successor to the Claremore campus of Rogers University, an 4 institution of higher education to be known as Rogers State 5 University. Rogers State University shall programmatically and 6 budgetarily function as a regional institution within The Oklahoma 7 State System of Higher Education, yet with a community college 8 component. It shall be authorized to offer no less than the average 9 number of programs and courses of study at other regional 10 institutions of similar size and enrollment.

B. Rogers State University shall operate as an institution within The Oklahoma State System of Higher Education and shall be governed by the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma. The president of Rogers State University shall report directly to the Board of Regents of the University of Oklahoma.

16 C. It is the intent of the Legislature that Rogers State 17 University be funded initially at a level consistent with the 18 average allocation and allotment of the institutions in the regional 19 funding tier as established by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 20 Education.

D. The Legislature recognizes the decision of the State Regents, pursuant to the powers vested in the State Regents by Section 2 of Article XIII-A of the Oklahoma Constitution, to change the function of Rogers State University, formerly known as the

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1 Claremore campus of Rogers University, to include a four-year 2 baccalaureate and graduate degree granting function, as quickly as 3 that can be done, giving due consideration to the protection of the 4 institution's regional accreditation status. The State Regents will 5 provide an annual report on the transition in Rogers State 6 University function to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of 7 Representatives, and the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, 8 beginning on January 1, 2000, and continuing until Rogers State 9 University is regionally accredited as a four-year baccalaureate and 10 graduate degree granting institution.

E. Rogers State University shall maintain a community college component within the university and shall maintain admission standards, academic policies, and practices for the community college component consistent with those approved for associate degree granting institutions by the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education.

F. Rogers State University is hereby authorized to contract with other regionally accredited institutions of higher education, specifically including Northeastern State University, for the delivery of courses and programs at any location where Rogers State University is authorized to deliver courses or programs. This authorization shall still remain in force after Rogers State University gains regional accreditation for upper division programs.

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1	SECTION 7. REPEALER 70 O.S. 2021, Section 4665, is
2	hereby repealed.
3	SECTION 8. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
4	SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
5	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
6	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
7	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
