SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-2.20D of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

- A. Any full-time employee of this state who has been employed for at least two years prior to the request shall be granted a leave of absence, subject to approval of the scheduling of such leave by the employee's appointing authority, with medical necessity being the primary determinant for such approval, for six (6) weeks for the birth or adoption of a child.
- B. An employee who is granted a leave of absence pursuant to the provisions of this section shall receive the base state pay

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    without interruption during the leave of absence. For purposes of
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    determining seniority, pay or pay advancement, and performance
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    awards, and for the receipt of any benefit that may be affected by a
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    leave of absence, the service of the employee shall be considered
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    uninterrupted by the leave of absence.
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        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
