- intentionally denying payment for health care services
- breaching fiduciary duty to honor written plan terms,
- exposing insureds, health care providers, and hospitals to balanced billing by reimbursing a provider at an amount lower than the in-network cost-
- providing lower rates for services provided, or
- any other practices prohibited by law.
- The task force shall be composed of the following and each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing authority:
- 1. One Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist, one Nurse Practitioner, and one Certified Nurse-Midwife, to be appointed by the Governor;
- 2. One Doctor of Medicine, one Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine, and one Doctor of Dental Surgery to be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate;
- Two members of the health insurance industry, and one Occupational Health Advisor, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; and

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1	4. The Insurance Commissioner or his or her designee who shall
2	serve as chairman and an ex-officio member of the task force.
3	C. The Insurance Department shall provide support and personnel
4	needed by the task force.
5	D. The Task Force on Rural Health Care Reimbursement shall
6	publish its findings and recommendations in a report to be delivered
7	to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, the
8	Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Chairman of the House
9	Insurance Committee, and the Chairman of the Senate Retirement and
10	Insurance Committee no later than December 1, 2024.
11	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
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
