12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
13	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
14	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4201.1 of Title 59, unless there
15	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
16	As used in this act:
17	1. "Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Herbal
18	Medicine" or "ACAHM" means the national organization that oversees
19	and credentials acupuncture college programs of study;
20	2. "Acupuncture and Asian medicine" means a system of primary
21	health care for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of human
22	health conditions, injury, and disease; the promotion or restoration
23	of health; and the support and stimulation of a patient's inherent

"Acupuncture physical application" means the therapeutic use by licensed acupuncturists of the actions or devices of electrical muscle stimulation, galvanic, diathermy, ultrasound, ultraviolet light, sauna, infrared light therapy, biofeedback, musculoskeletal technique, and therapeutic exercise;
- 4. "Approved acupuncture and Asian medical program" means an acupuncture and Asian medical education program in the United States or abroad that meets the requirements for accreditation by the Accreditation Commission for Acupuncture and Herbal Medicine (ACAHM) or an equivalent federally recognized accrediting body for the acupuncture and Asian medical profession recognized by the Acupuncture and Asian Medicine Committee created in Section 2 of this act, or the State Department of Health. This program must be an institution, or part of an institution, of higher education that at the time the student completes the program is:
 - a. either accredited or is a candidate for accreditation by a regional institutional accrediting agency recognized by the State of Oklahoma or the United States Department of Education, or
 - b. a degree-granting college or university that:
 - (1) prior to the existence of ACAHM offered a fulltime structured curriculum in acupuncture and

1 supervised patient care which constituted a master's level acupuncture education program that was equivalent to the requirements of ACAHM,

- is in good standing in the judgment of the State Department of Health;
- 5. "Approved substances" means over-the-counter substances, food extracts, vitamins, minerals, or other dietary supplements, botanical preparations, and a limited formulary of legend drugs;
- 6. "Committee" means the Acupuncture and Asian Medicine Committee;
 - "Department" means the State Department of Health;
- 8. "License" means the document of authorization issued by the State Department of Health for a person to engage in the practice of acupuncture and Asian medicine;
- "Licensed acupuncturist" means a practitioner of acupuncture and Asian medicine who has been properly licensed for that purpose;
- "National Certification Commission for Acupuncture and 10. Oriental Medicine" or "NCCAOM" means the national credentialing body of acupuncturists which determines if an individual has completed the requirements to be eligible to sit for the national board exams. The Commission also administers the national board exams; and
- "Practicing acupuncture and Asian medicine" means the 11. surgical use of single-use needles inserted into and removed from

A. There is hereby established the Acupuncture and Asian Medicine Committee to assist the State Department of Health in approval for applicants and to advise the Department on all matters pertaining to the licensure, education, and continuing education of licensed acupuncturists and the practice of acupuncture and Asian medicine.

- B. The Acupuncture and Asian Medicine Committee shall consist of seven (7) members who shall be appointed by the State Department of Health as follows:
- 1. Four members who are licensed to practice acupuncture and Asian medicine. Nominations for these four members shall be submitted by the Oklahoma Society of Acupuncturists and Asian Medicine;
- 2. One member who is a layperson who is not and who has never been licensed to practice acupuncture and Asian medicine, or is a member of any closely related profession;
 - 3. One member from the State of Department of Health; and
- 4. One member who is licensed by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision.
- C. Members of the Committee shall be appointed for terms of four (4) years or for the remainder of an unexpired term of a vacancy. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. Vacancies on the Committee shall be filled by the Committee in the same manner as the original appointment.

- D. Members of the Committee shall not be compensated but may be reimbursed for all actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of duties.
 - E. The Committee shall have the power and duty to:
 - 1. Assist the State Department of Health in promulgating rules;
- 2. Assist in approving courses for continuing education units and in determining which applicants have met the requirements set forth by the Department and the Committee;
- 3. Advise the State Department of Health on all matters pertaining to the licensure, education, and continuing education requirements for the practice of acupuncture and Asian medicine in this state;
- 4. Assist and advise in all hearings involving licensed acupuncturists who are deemed to be in violation of this act; and
 - 5. Establish and maintain a reasonable fees and fines schedule. SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
