6 AS INTRODUCED

7 A Resolution designating April 5, 2023, as the 23rd  
8 Annual 4-H Day at the Capitol.

11 WHEREAS, 4-H is the youth development component of the Oklahoma  
12 State University Extension geared toward young people ages 5 to 19,  
13 and;

14 WHEREAS, for 115 years, 4-H has helped thousands of club members  
15 develop life skills such as leadership, decision making and civic  
16 engagement, and;

17 WHEREAS, programming in 4-H is changing continually to meet the  
18 needs of today's youth, and;

19 WHEREAS, the Oklahoma 4-H Youth Development Program reinforces  
20 the learn-by-doing philosophy through hands-on learning  
21 opportunities, and;

22 WHEREAS, 4-H reaches nearly 92,781 participants each year through  
23 membership, project clubs and school enrichment, and;

1       WHEREAS, youth involved in 4-H strive to improve the quality of  
2 life around the state and work to improve Oklahoma communities for  
3 the betterment of all citizens, and;

4       WHEREAS, with a focus on health, nearly 29,000 youth were  
5 reached through healthy living programs, and;

6       WHEREAS, more than 11,400 club members, as part of OSU Extension  
7 and Langston University, participate in science, technology,  
8 engineering and math (STEM) projects, and;

9       WHEREAS, nearly 9,600 youth have participated in environmental  
10 education programs, and;

11       WHEREAS, with agriculture being the backbone of Oklahoma, more  
12 than 46,380 youth contacts were made through agricultural  
13 programming, and;

14       WHEREAS, youth who participate in 4-H are four times more likely  
15 to make contributions to their communities, and;

16       WHEREAS, there are nearly 1,600 adult volunteer leaders who  
17 provide leadership and foster a positive adult/youth partnership,  
18 and;

19       WHEREAS, there are more than 400 youth volunteers who develop  
20 life skills by serving as mentors/role models and provide leadership  
21 to club members, and;

22       WHEREAS, 4-H provides programming beyond traditional  
23 agricultural projects, including food and nutrition, horticulture,

1 photography, robotics, community development, companion animals and  
2 more, and;

3 WHEREAS, youth participating in 4-H are encouraged to share with  
4 state leaders how 4-H is making communities better through project  
5 work and service learning activities, and;

6 WHEREAS, adult volunteer leaders and club members combined  
7 annually contribute more than 100,000 volunteer hours to the  
8 betterment of Oklahoma, and;

9 WHEREAS, 4-H members continue to work together and follow the  
10 motto to "Make the Best Better" in all that they do, and;

11 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES  
12 OF THE 1ST SESSION OF THE 59TH OKLAHOMA LEGISLATURE:

13 THAT the Oklahoma House of Representatives hereby proclaims  
14 April 5, 2022, as the 24th Annual 4-H Day at the Capitol in  
15 Oklahoma, celebrating youth who have made an impact on the community  
16 and who are stepping up to the challenges of a complex and changing  
17 world, and continuing to share the positive impact Oklahoma 4-H has  
18 on our youth, our communities and our state because "We Are Oklahoma  
19 4-H."
