Research Analysis

HB 1774 requires the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission to be subject to the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act and the Competitive Bidding Act of 1974 when contracting for property analysis or for promotional programs and projects. The measure also repeals <u>Title 74 Sections 2239</u> and <u>2244</u>, which relate to purchasing exemptions.

Fiscal Analysis

HB 1774 removes the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Commission from being exempt from the competitive bidding requirements of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. The measure also repeals two statute sections related to purchasing exemptions. Per the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department (OTRD), the repeal of §74-2244 would potentially impact revenue to OTRD as it would limit dynamic pricing options, with an estimated impact of \$4,900,000. The repeal of §74-2239 impacts contracts, which includes maintenance, which impacts both revenue to OTRD from rooms and additional costs for higher contract costs. Total, the agency expects a combined revenue and fiscal impact of \$50,000,000, resulting in a need for additional appropriations to cover this impact.
