**Research Analysis**

HB 1845 requires a peace officer to make every attempt to serve an emergency temporary order of protection and emergency temporary ex parte orders and complete a return of service when filing the petition with the district court. If the peace officer is unable to obtain service, the petition is to be filed by the court clerk the next business day and document the hearing date and time assigned to the case. The petition is to be filed and issued to the appropriate office of the county sheriff to obtain service with priority.

**Fiscal Analysis**

This measure requires that peace officers make certain efforts to file emergency temporary orders of protection and that court clerks complete certain procedures based upon the outcome of these efforts.
