Research Analysis

The committee substitute for HB 2152, reduces the membership of The Maternal Mortality Review Committee from 25 members to 24 members by lowering the number of positions that are appointed by the State Commissioner of Health. The measure also requires hospitals and licensed birthing centers to report all maternal deaths that occur on the premises during pregnancy or within a year of the termination of a pregnancy to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner within 72 hours of the death occurring and requires the medical examiner to investigate these deaths. The measure outlines the materials that the Chief Medical Examiner may share with the Maternal Mortality Review Committee.
