HB 2770, as introduced, provides that individuals with minor children who are employed by the State of Oklahoma are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy Program administered by the Department of Human Services.

**Fiscal Analysis**

From DHS:

Oklahoma's Child Care Subsidy Program is funded through the Child Care and Development (CCDF) Program, which is the primary federal funding source to help low-income families pay for the cost of child care while they work or participate in education or training activities. As such, families cannot have household income in excess of 85% of State Median Income per federal regulations at 45 CFR 98.21.

**Any and all cost associated with this legislation, outside of individuals who would meet subsidy guidelines, would have to be funded entirely through state funds.**

**The agency has requested information from OMES detailing the total number of state employees with dependent children. Building an estimate of complete fiscal impact without detailed information on the number of state employees with dependent children and their monthly income is not possible due to the complexity of data involved in such an estimate.**
