**Research Analysis**

The committee substitute to HB 2919 increases the maximum number of full-time equivalent employes for the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners, and the State Board of Examiners of Perfusionist from 29 to 35 employees and for the State Board of Osteopathic Examiners from seven to nine employees.

**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2919 establishes maximum full-time employee (FTE) limits for certain agencies, boards, commissions, departments, and programs. Establishing such FTE limits on non-appropriated agencies should not result in a negative fiscal impact. Therefore, in its current form, the measure is not anticipated to have a direct fiscal impact on the state budget or appropriations.
