Fiscal Analysis

This measure codifies in statute new crimes that relate to assault on certain county employees. The frequency of such new crime is not predictable. Penalties range from misdemeanor to felony and, depending on the offense, the fines are \$1,000-\$2,000 and/or imprisonment within the Department of Corrections (DOC) for up to 2 years. In its current form, HB3767 has the potential to generate new revenues for the Administrative Office of the Courts (AOC), new imprisonments within the DOC at a marginal cost of \$16.60/day per inmate to be absorbed by existing budgetary resources, and is not anticipated to have a material impact on state budget or appropriations.
