Research Analysis

FA 1 to HB 4156 adds new sections 4 through 12. The amendment removes language relating to identification documents being provided only to United States citizens, nationals and legal permanent resident aliens. The amendment prohibits any applicant or licensee providing an individual tax identification number to Service Oklahoma from receiving voter registration services and requires Service Oklahoma to weekly transmit to the State Election Board a list of identifying information of all applicants or licensees who have provided an individual tax identification number. The State Election Board is to compare identifying information with the list of registered voters in each county and notify the secretary of any relevant county election board of any matches. The amendment requires persons applicants or licensees providing an individual tax identification number to pay an additional \$50 when making application or renewal for a Class D License. The amendment allows an alien to offer proof of having filed a state tax return for the 2024 tax year in order to make application for a driver license. The amendment allows an unexpired passport of any country to serve as primary and secondary proofs of identity when making application for a driver license. The amendment directs Service Oklahoma to identify licenses issued pursuant to an individual tax identification number by prominently printing "ITIN Non-citizen" on the license and print a statement that the license holder is not a U.S. citizen and is ineligible to vote in any election" on all driver licenses.

Fiscal Analysis

The FA1 to HB4156 sets forth provisions for agencies to process identification cards for aliens. ServiceOK is directed to design a notation that demarcates these identification cards. Officials with ServiceOK are researching potential costs that the agency may incur as a result of updating the necessary software to implement this provision. An applicant or licensee that obtains one of these licenses shall be required to pay an additional \$50, however the number of these identification cards that will be issues is not predictable.

The Oklahoma Tax Commission (OTC) is directed to confirm certain information with ServiceOK. Officials with the OTC have provided the following information:

In order to administer the provisions of HB4156, the OTC would need access to Social Security Numbers to verify tax filing information. This would require a web service that would give ServiceOK query capability. The estimated impact to the OTC to develop this system is approximately a \$60,000 in administrative costs, 1 FTE, and 2 months of development time.
