**Research Analysis**

The Conference Committee Report for SB266 accepts House amendments and restores the title.

SB 266 provides that an area may be designated as a subprecinct if fewer than 1,500 registered voters are affected. Previously, an area could be a subprecinct if fewer than 500 registered voters were affected. Separate election materials must be provided so that separate certification will be made of each subprecinct's election results.

**Fiscal Analysis**

The CCR for SB 266 allows sub precincts to be designated if fewer than one thousand five hundred (1,500) registered voters are affected. Per the State Election Board (SEB), this change would have a minimal fiscal impact for the agency.
